Fahrenheit 50 1/2° at 7 - breakfast over at 8 40'' - preparing for going to my apartment R. St. Victor taking books &c. - off at 9 - note from M.[Monsieur] Julliard just before setting off to say he would be there at 10 1/2 - arranging 1 thing or other - buying crockery &c. &c. On going about wood, they asked me 44/- a voie for bois neuf (at the chantier in the R. de Seine) - an imposition quite - M.[Monsieur] Julliard having called to ascertain that I was there came again about 10 3/4 - some time in arranging ourselves - fixing up towels as blinds &c. Lesson from 11 10'' to 1 3/4 - 1st I have had in my little pied à terre R. St. Victor - think I shall do very well there - *he brought a womans head between thirty and forty so full of lice had been obliged to burn all the hair off and the smell of the singing and the turpentine prevailed over all other smells he dissected laid bare and we studied the 5 muscles massetu, temporal, buccinateur, grande triangulaire des lèvres, and le grand zygomatique - felt no disgust Mr. Julliard said I was quite guerie that is had got over all qualms the head left with me folded in duster § my aunt came for me in the carriage at 2 - waited above 1/2 hour - then au gagne petit to buy serviettes &c. - did not think they paid attention enough in serving me, so walked out of the shop (said nothing to my aunt) and drove to the shop no. 2 Place Neuve de la Madeleine - civility extreme - bought all I wanted, and think the man has won my custom - home at 4 to leave what I had bought and set Cameron to work - then at 4 1/2 off back again to R. St. Victor - my aunt took a little drive while I had the serrurier and menuisier - good lock for the outdoor will be 30/- and tringles and hooks for the little window curtains 2/- per window - shelves at -/50 per pied - the man will fix me a shelf projecting 18 pouces from the windows for un petit jardinier at 6/- per window - painting will be 1/- per window - said I would think about it - then asked the portière au Jardin des Plantes to speak to Pierre ..... to get me a good place at M. Brongniart's lecture tomorrow home at 6 50'' - dinner at 7 10'' - came to my room at 9 1/4 - on coming home at 4*

found 2 cards from "Madame and Mademoiselle Mackenzie R. de Londres no. 32" - wrote all the above of today, and had just done it at 9 40/" - coffee at 10 - came to my room at 10 40/" - settling accounts till 11 - fine day - Fahrenheit 52° at 10 40/" p.m.
