- A. Meeting called to order at 8:32am.
- B. Discussion with Dr. Geithman
 - a. LCAP (Local Control Accountability Plan): Need to align resources to achieve three goals:
 - i. Equity: we have a problem with equity. We need to shrink the gap: socioeconomic disparity, disabilities, English learners, Spanish/Latino families.
 - ii. Academic Excellence: might not be as much visibility of this goal as there are for goals one and three.
 - 1. iReady: Goal is for all students to make a year's worth of growth
 - a. What do we do with this data? Our school district is constantly making implementations based on data.
 - i.e. Groups are created based on iReady Math results and specific interventions implemented.
 - ii. If results show slower than one year's growth, the student's growth needs to be accelerated.
 - 2. CAASP: Autopsy for how the year went.
 - 3. Guaranteed Viable Curriculum: all students across one grade level are exposed to the same curriculum and greater ideas.
 - 4. Curriculum
 - a. Literacy curriculum K-8 just adopted. About to adopt a Math and Science curriculum.
 - b. We want to build a capacity with teachers so that they own the curriculum and want to teach it at that time (they need discretion). We can't have a curriculum police.
 - c. Curriculum needs to match the instructional strategies, otherwise we will see too many inconsistencies.
 - iii. Wellness: Students need to feel safe at school.
 - b. Readiness for high school
 - i. Are we lacking in pillars of study habits?
 - 1. Many people feel their kids can't write a coherent 5-paragraph essay, take notes, study for tests, allocate their time, etc.
 - 2. Hall students seem to be bored and unprepared for Redwood.
 - ii. There is a unanimous acknowledgement from the public and across the LCMSD board that there is a deep desire to address our academic readiness goal.
 - 1. What are we going to do *right now*?
 - a. We need shorter term goals.

- An actionable step could be monitoring technology usage/playing games in class when they're done with their work.
 - i. One member asks, why are they done with their work in class at all?
 - 1. "Bell to bell": increasing consistency; students will rise to the occasion.
- iii. Role of schools has drastically changed
 - 1. School used to be much more simplified and straightforward.
 - 2. Much more of schooling is online now.
- iv. Math Placement
 - 1. Geometry is highest level of a math as a high school freshman.
 - 2. Percentage of students from each middle school going into highest level of math
 - a. Hall is 48%; second highest. We also have a large percentage going into foundational math.
 - 3. There have to be multiple measures to place a student into an advanced class, not one test or class.
 - 4. We have a Mathletes group

C. Dr. Brown Update

- a. Danceathon
 - Next Friday. Dancing in gym for 45 minutes. Will fund the end-of-year Field Day.
 - ii. 99 Pledges: goal is around \$35 of donations per student.
 - iii. If we have a raffle, all students need to be included (per PTA guidelines) regardless of whether or not they have donated.
