#### **Discussion Topics:**

- NYC Opt Out (Reyhan)
  - More standardized tests than ever, including screeners now for Kindergarten

- You can still opt out. The data goes to the district, and it goes to the company that
  administers the tests. Districts know if a school doesn't submit data, and they need to see
  that parents have opted out.
- There is also new mandated ELA curriculum for pre-K and K.
- The scores are going up because the curriculum is test prep curriculum (like 90 minute blocks for kindergarten to learn rigorously paced curriculum)
- District 15 is doing <u>Wit and Wisdom</u> for ELA. The only other district doing this one is District 19, and the parents are super happy.
- Even BNS has to administer these tests, though it still has a very strong opt-out parent community. Every opt-out request for NYC screeners requires a meeting with Diane and she needs to have a record of a meeting with parents to convince them to not opt-out
- School budget is devoted to supporting substitutes so teachers are not required to administer the screeners
- BNS has a 95-98% opt-out rate. Most students at most schools take these tests. Services are not available during testing days/weeks
- Teachers have to also spend time grading the tests
- Most teachers say that none of the data from any of the tests has any value to instruction.
   Kids get scores, but the breakdown of why a student gets it wrong does really tell you why the child got the question wrong.
- Scores are correlated with income
- The state changes every year what the 1, 2, 3, 4 mean. They come up with a raw score with teachers, but they adjust the meaning of the 1, 2, 3, 4 so they can politically motivate for certain types of messaging. They will change the scores to show poor performance if they want to deal punishment to the school; if they want to good performance by the chancellor, they will adjust the scoring system to mean something positive.
- One year they released questions to showcase
- A good or bad score on the test does nothing for a kid. Teachers unions have fought hard to make sure that the bad score doesn't affect teachers or schools either. So, it's really mostly impacting the teaching time.
- These don't prepare you for the tests at other schools because they are not structured the same way (including regents, etc.). Especially because these tests don't test what you learn in the classroom, they test on very obscure types of questions.
- Since the pandemic, middle schools do not use test scores from elementary school for admissions purposes. Many students come in without any tests, or transfer from other states, etc.
- Students get the experience of testing their knowledge, just not using the NY State tests


\*\*\*ANNOUNCEMENT\*\*\* Amy Sumner shared that she is retiring at the end of the school year.

#### **Finance**

- Still have lots of money to raise. We are at 28.6% of our annual budget. We are technically on track, but we would like raise more than our budget to build up a buffer.
  - Lots of corporate matching this year.
- Spend is happening, mostly on supplies.
- Participatory budgeting we got two proposals. One is to renovate the cafeteria (it will
  possibly be on the ballot) and we will want folks to vote on things. Anyone 10 and up can
  vote.
  - Should we volunteer to be a voting site? YES!

#### Ideas to implement

- Proposal to combine communications fundraising with other events (movie night, school play, etc.), so we can have greater outreach to fundraising and financing needs.
- Looking for a popcorn machine it's how we make our fundraising money at movie nights. A new (fast) one is \$1000.
  - Ameila offered to bring the popcorn machine from her party company to the next concession event.
- DOE has a restriction on bake sales only once a month. It relates to specific types of baking (but doesn't apply to chips or other packaged food). We could sell other things, popcorn, etc.
- Other kinds of fundraising methods: Mabels Labels, See's Candies (Amelia offered to do some research on this).

Social media action: add passive income streams into Linktree on Instagram

### Fundraising

- Annual appeal (Laura) fundraising is happening now, and it's going out through the class parents in each classroom. Ideas have been shared (like gift cards for teachers to buy classroom needs)
- Grants committee (Melissa / Ani) there are 4-5 parents who are starting to write grants.
  Three different groups (Band, BAX, Science). Thinking of adding more categories (like
  Art, etc.). The idea would be to form these groups of parents, start doing research, and
  start applying to grants).
- Jennifer created an awesome form to collect interst from parents who want to participate or lend skills.
- More ideas about our next event, and need more people and will need volunteers to make it all happen. We want to raise \$R20,000.
- Kids to create enveleops and can put the letter inside (or even a QR code) to encourage more donations.

# **Budget**

Last year, we raised \$182,000 (goal was \$280,000). We spent \$220,000. Direct giving is the primary method of fundraising. We don't hold as many events as other schools

We used to have 720 kids 8 years ago. Over the course of the pandemic, we reduced class size to 25-27 but keep the PTA and DOE fundings the same. Now we have 660 kids, smaller class size, but balanced offerings and staff numbers.
