The introduction is written in Times New Roman font size 12 with 1.15 space. The introductory section describes the background of the research problem, literature facts, research gaps, novelty, research question, and the purpose of writing. The problem must be clear and requires research to solve the problem. For Arabic writing or fragments of verses from the Qur'an, the Traditional Arabic font size is 16. Foreign language words or phrases are written in italics, while Arabic-Latin transliteration refers to Arabic-Indonesian transliteration according to the SKB 3 Menteri. The body of paper must be elaborated between 4.500 - 7.000 words (maximum) including abstract and references.
