

"CLOSED TO PUBLIC" TEEN SERVICES ACTIVITIES

- → Currently, all library locations are closed until Monday, March 23, 2020.
- → Maker Faire 2020 is rescheduled to September 26, 2020.
- → Jennifer sent out an email with activities for Teen Services Librarians (and Liaisons, if able) to do during the closure:
 - Physical inventory: teen supplies on hand...and from Shared Resources list.
 - Look at the supplies you have on hand, and make a list of what you currently have and in what quantities. That way you can offer this to

- teens; ilf teens have an opportunity to see a list of what is available at your location, this can help them make decisions on what to do during programming.
- Also, double check any Shared Resources you may have currently checked out and ensure that this is accurately reflected on the Teen Services Shared Resources (TSSR) catalog. With that in mind, check the TSSR catalog to see if something says it is checked out to you, but you have already returned it.
- Weed & remove duplicates from YA Fiction collection
 - Since it's March anyway, everyone should be weeding. This is also an opportunity to remove duplicates from your YA collection.
 - Jennifer's recommendation is to use a "Hasn't checked out in 12 month" criteria. Of course, this timeframe can be adjusted depending on your location's situation; compare 12 months to 18 months to 24 months and see what would be best for YA collection.
 - If you are unable to run lists, ask your location's Holdings Editor, contact Daniella @ Collins Garden, or call the Teen Library to help.
- Integration of CD Audio (remaining after weeding) into YA Fiction Collection
 - If, after weeding, you still have a lot of YA audiobooks... Work with your manager to determine if you can move your YA audiobooks next to your Adult audiobooks (especially if you suspect that mostly adults are checking them out).
 - If, after weeding, you do not have many YA audiobooks left... see if you can integrate/intershelve the YA audiobooks into your YA fiction collection. This was done at Guerra and a few other locations.
- Look, really look, at your branch's teen space
 - Look at the space with "fresh eyes"... If someone else was looking at your space, what would THEY see?
 - Try to figure out changes you can make in the space that will improve what the space looks like. Make simple changes that can make it more inviting to teens, and foster an opportunity for teens to take ownership of the space through art or other contributions (such as removing old art).
