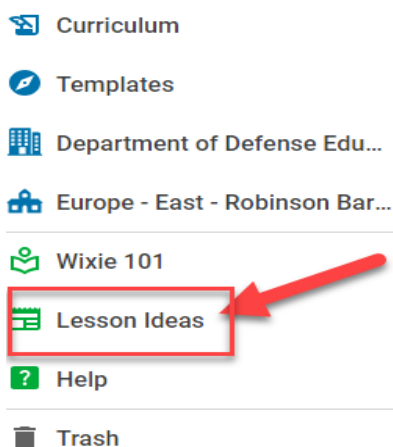


Using Wixie Templates and Other Resources - How to Make Them Your Own

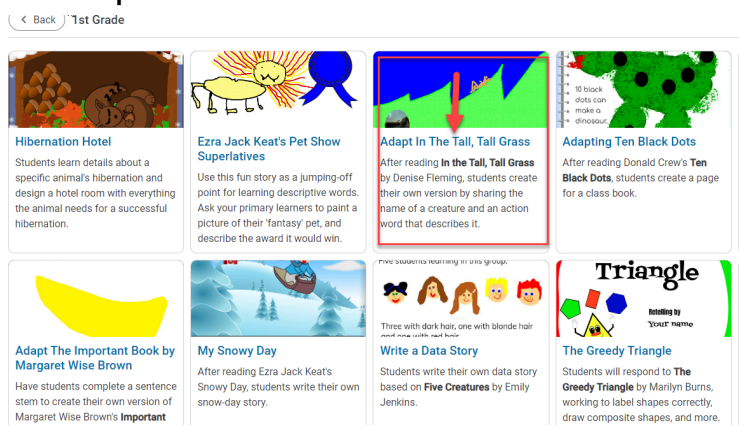
1. Open Wixie in Classlink



2. Go to **Lesson Ideas** on the Right Side



3. Choose a Lesson you would like to look at and click on it. You can explore the lesson.




4. Click on the Lesson Template to open the the lesson **template**.

Read **In the Tall, Tall Grass** by Denise Fleming to your students. This is a great story for building observation and data collection skills as the foundation of the scientific method.

Have students create their own version by sharing the name of a creature and an action word that describes it.

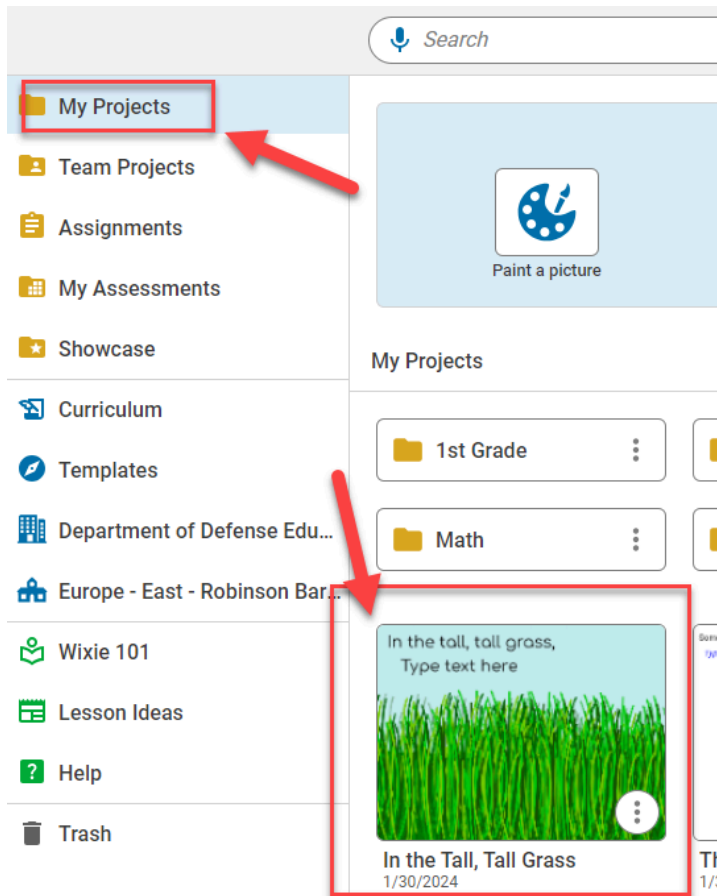
5. Click on Customize at the top of the screen. The template will be saved in your project folder. You will be able to edit and assign the lesson.



6. You can edit the template, add directions, change the settings and then when you have the template the way you would like it, you can assign the assignment to your class.



7. Click on the house in the left-hand corner to SAVE.
