All citations have author's last name first, followed by author initials <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Mardis, L. A.</li> <li>- <a href="#">More examples</a></li> </ul>		
All citations only listed the (Year) of publication for <a href="#">journals</a> and <a href="#">books</a> ; listed the (Year, Month Day) for <a href="#">magazines</a> , <a href="#">newspapers</a> , and <a href="#">websites</a> . If you were unable to find an explicitly listed date, use n.d. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- (2015).</li> <li>- (2017, November/December).</li> <li>- (2016, January 15).</li> <li>- (n.d.).</li> </ul>		
Only capitalize the first letter of the first word and the first word of the subtitle, acronyms, and proper nouns for each title of an <a href="#">eBook/book</a> , <a href="#">article</a> , <a href="#">webpage</a> , etc. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- On the move with Michelle Obama: An interview about her first year</li> <li>- Exploring well-being among US Hispanics/Latinos in a church-based institution: A qualitative study</li> </ul>		
Capitalized all major words in <a href="#">journal/magazine/newspaper</a> titles (e.g., <i>Journal of Adolescent Health</i> )		
<a href="#">Journal/magazine/newspaper</a> , <a href="#">book/eBook</a> , and <a href="#">webpage</a> titles were in italics - volume numbers were also in italics <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <i>Phi Delta Kappan</i>, 99(3),</li> </ul>		
Did not include a place of publication (city/state) for <a href="#">books/eBooks</a>		
When available, provided the DOI for <a href="#">articles</a> . DOI should be in URL format <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <a href="https://doi.org/10.17275/per.19.21.6.2">https://doi.org/10.17275/per.19.21.6.2</a></li> </ul>		
If a DOI is not available for <a href="#">articles</a> and <a href="#">eBooks</a> located in academic (subscription) databases, cited like a print publication (did not include a link or permalink).		
If a DOI was not available for <a href="#">articles</a> and <a href="#">eBooks</a> located on the “free” web (non-database), included the URL <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <a href="https://journals.uic.edu/ojs/index.php/fm/article/view/10124/8288">https://journals.uic.edu/ojs/index.php/fm/article/view/10124/8288</a></li> </ul>		
References page was titled References. The title was bold and centered <b>References</b>		

Reference list entries used hanging-indents (Ctrl+T), were double-spaced (Ctrl+2), and alphabetized by the last name of the first author (or the first word in the title if no author was available)
