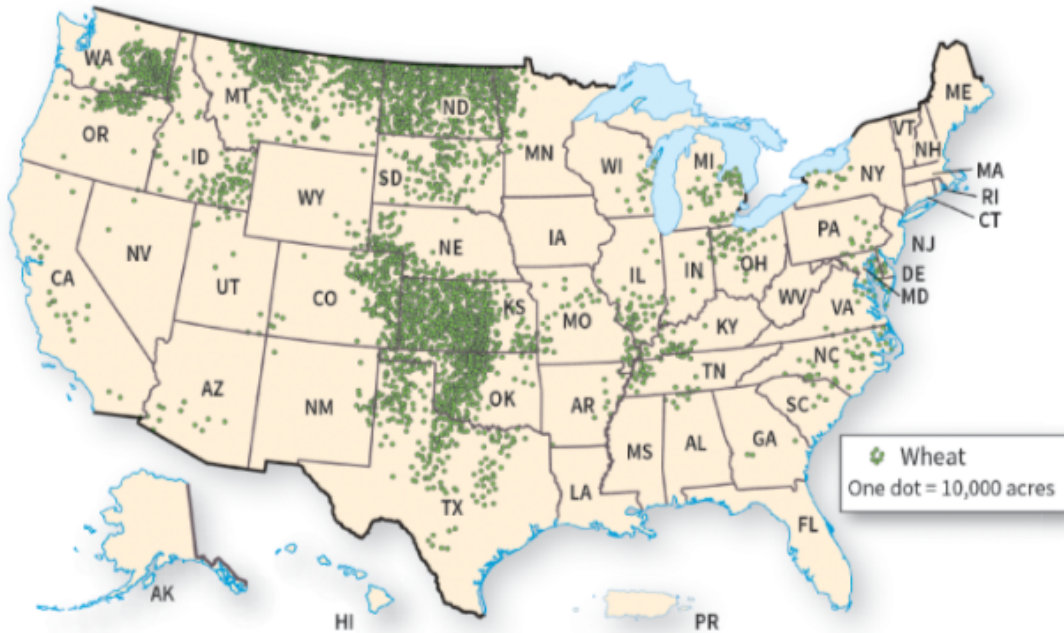
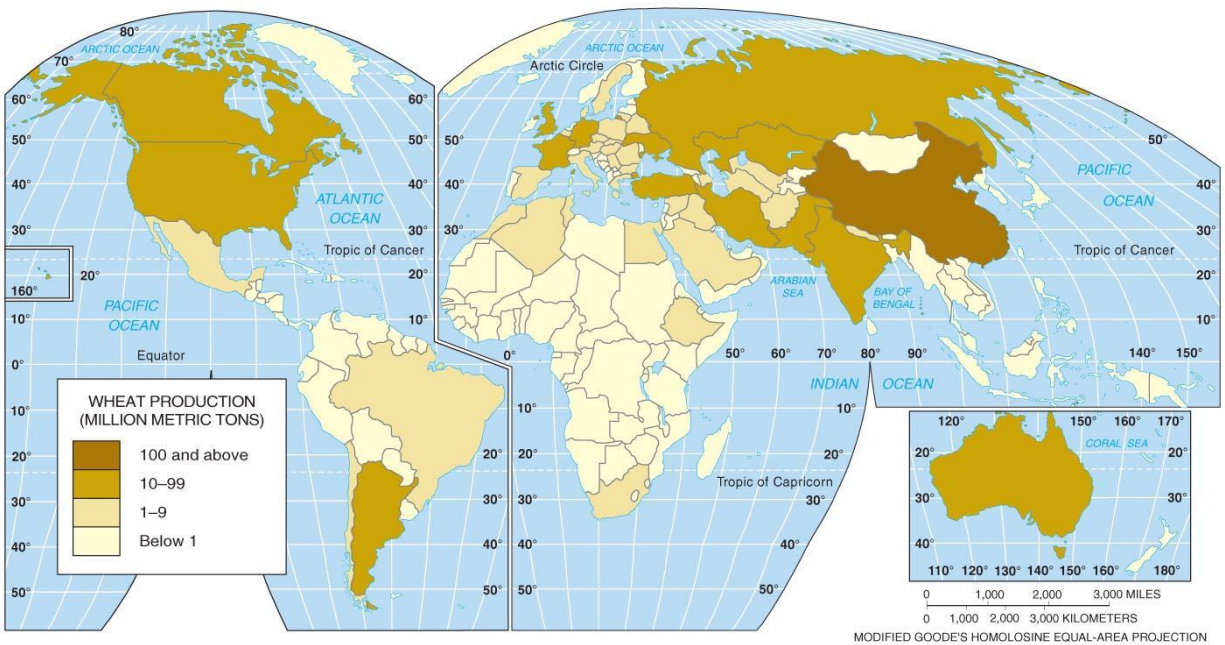


Types of Maps Practice FRQ

1. Reference maps focus on places, while thematic maps emphasize data such as spatial patterns of geographic statistics or attributes. Thematic maps may show a single attribute, or the relationship among several attributes.
