## Listening 15: The Pipe Organ

Warm up:

Optional: get sillies out and zip lips
Warm up ears to listen to music.
Warm up hands on heart to feel the music.
Warm up hands to draw what you feel.
There is no wrong thing to draw!

- 1. Play 1st song. Have children draw, but don't introduce song.
- 2. Share info
  - a. Fugue sur le theme du Carillon des Heures de la Cathedrale de Soissons, Op. 12/ Fugue on the theme of the Hourly bell chime at the Soissons Cathedral.
  - b. Pipe organ
  - c. Maurice Durufle (1902-1986)/ performed by Henry Fairs (b.1976)
  - d. Durufle was a French composer, the piece was written in 1962.
  - e. Cathedral of Soissons began being built in 1177!
- 3. Listen again and draw.
- 4. Play 2nd song. Have children draw, but don't introduce song.
- 5. Share info
  - a. Toccata and Fugue in D minor, BWV 565
  - b. Pipe organ
  - c. Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750, Germany)/ performed by Hannes Kastner
  - d. Written ~1704-1750's, included in Disney's Fantasia (1946)
  - e. Bach= German Baroque composer.
- 6. Listen again and draw.

The pipe organ is essentially a group of whistles.

Ancestors of the pipe organ were present thousands of years ago.
