











INFANT ACTIVITIES WORKSHEET

	<p>This can teach a child how to put colors in order by size and teach them how to count too as they count the amount of blocks they take out. It also works their emotional development because colors make one feel emotion.</p>	<p>I felt happy and I liked putting the blocks back together.</p>
