

Action Opportunity - Urgent Request for Help Regarding Childhood Sexual Abuse

Peter Newman is set to have a parole hearing on 9/25/2024 and I'm asking for you to write a parole protest letter and send it to the Senior Victims Service Specialist at the Missouri Department of Corrections.

We have the opportunity to have as many victims, friends, family, and supporters of victims to have their voices heard in front of the board of probation and parole in an effort to deny Newman's parole considerations which could impact his time served in prison.

These letters would serve victims and give us the support to hopefully keep Newman behind bars as long as the state allows. Below is the information on where to send the letters and also a short outline of how the letters could be formed.

Thank you for considering writing a letter and supporting Newman victims and keeping children safe from his evil actions as long as we can.

Anonymous statements are acceptable if desired.

Subject: Parole Protest for Peter Newman, Offender 01206755

Dear Parole Board Members,

- **Introduce yourself:** Who you are, relationship to victims, clear protest statement

- **Talk about crime's impact:** How did it affect victims, how did it affect you, how does it affect you today. Get personal if you're able to.
- **Talk about impact of Newman's parole:** emotional effects, safety effects, community effects if he is granted parole. Why is it a bad idea to grant parole?
- **Clear opposition of parole statement:** Tell them to deny parole, delay parole until as long as the law allows. Show your complete opposition.
- **Closing remarks:** Closing statement summarizing why you're in opposition and thanking the board for reading statements.
