Introduction



Congratulations! You are beginning a journey of faith as you prepare to receive the sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation preparation involves learning, sharing, fellowship, and spiritual growth. You will have the opportunity to learn more about your Catholic faith and what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ.

“Confirmation is the sacrament by which the baptized are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed. The reception of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace.” (CCC 1285)

Confirmation perfects Baptismal grace; it is the sacrament which gives us the Holy Spirit in order to root us more deeply as children of God, incorporate us more firmly into Christ, strengthen our bond with the Church, associate us more closely with her mission, and help us to bear witness to the Christian faith in words accompanied by deeds.

Confirmation, like Baptism, imprints a spiritual mark or indelible character on the Christian soul; for this reason one can receive this sacrament only once.

A Christian does not live as a child of God through his or her own efforts alone, but through the grace of God. We see this in a practical way, when we look back on our own lives and the lives of others, even the lives of saints. Therefore, it is our duty to seek the grace that God offers us in order to live our lives as Christians in the way that God intends.

Expectations of the Confirmation Candidate:

- ◆ Participate in weekly Mass and receive the sacraments of Communion and Confession regularly
- ◆ Attend and participate in class, either through Saint Theresa School or the parish Religious Education Program
- ◆ Attend and participate in scheduled activities, including the Rite of Intention, the retreat, and rehearsal
- ◆ Perform community service during the two years leading to Confirmation

- ◆ Meet all requirements as defined in this handbook
- ◆ Submit this completed handbook as requested by the Director of Religious Formation prior to the scheduled date of Confirmation

Roles and Responsibilities of Parents

“As the primary educators of their children, parents are to be intimately involved in the catechesis for Confirmation. This will help them renew and strengthen their own faith, besides enabling them to set a better example for their children.” (NCD 119)

Because parents:

- ◆ Are the primary educators of their children
- ◆ Are responsible for initiating their children into the sacramental life
- ◆ Serve as models for their children by being committed Christians

Parents should expect to:

- ◆ Worship with your families regularly
- ◆ Attend the scheduled parent meetings
- ◆ Be actively involved in the Confirmation preparation of the candidate
- ◆ Engage in discussions about the material being studied including sharing your understanding and perspective
- ◆ Encourage your child to reflect and thoughtfully consider the decision to receive the sacrament of Confirmation
- ◆ Pray for your child’s spiritual growth every day
- ◆ Support and encourage completion of assignments, activities, and expectations
- ◆ Emphasize the importance of the sacrament of Confirmation by taking an active part in the preparation for and celebration of Confirmation
- ◆ Assist in retreats, service work, meetings, classes, spiritual events, and social events
- ◆ Faithfully bring your child to classes, programs, and events that are planned to help your child prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation



To be completed in preparation for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation:

- € Attendance at 2 years of Religious Education (either through Catholic school or REP)
- € Attendance at 40 hours Rite of Intention during seventh grade year
- € Attendance at Confirmation Retreat during eighth grade year
- € Attendance at a minimum of 7 devotions during two year preparation period
- € Complete Confirmation Booklet including:
 - o Confirmation Name page
 - o Christian Service Reflections
- € 3 separate faith discussions with sponsor
- € Letter to Pastor asking to be Confirmed
- € Reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation prior To Confirmation

The Confirmation Sponsor

Each candidate for the sacrament of Confirmation must choose a sponsor. Sponsors are chosen because they are seen as persons who can be role models of the Catholic Faith. The Rite of Confirmation expresses that the sponsor has a three-fold purpose in support of the one to be confirmed. “The sponsor brings the candidate to receive the sacrament, presents the candidate to the minister for anointing, and will later help the candidate fulfill his/her baptismal promises faithfully under the influence of the Holy Spirit.” (Introduction, Rite of Confirmation)

Requirements of the Sponsor

- o They must be 16 years of age or older
- o They must be fully initiated into the life of Christ by having received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation
- o If married, they must be married with the Catholic sacrament of Matrimony
- o They must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and a practicing member by participation in the celebration of Mass each weekend, by the reception of Holy Communion and Confessions on a regular basis, and by living a life in conformity to faith and morality as taught by Christ in the Gospels

Restrictions concerning Sponsors

- o A parent **cannot** be a sponsor
- o If a person has not received all 3 sacraments of initiation (baptism, confirmation, communion) they **cannot** be a sponsor
- o If a person was baptized and raised Catholic but now belongs to another faith, they **cannot** be a sponsor
- o If a person is in an invalid marriage, or if a person is cohabiting with another person in a relationship without the sacrament of Marriage, they **cannot** be a sponsor
- o If the person rejects the teachings of the Gospel and the Catholic Church, they **cannot** be a sponsor
- o If the person was denied a sponsor certificate in another parish and they join Saint Theresa Parish to obtain one, the judgment of the previous pastor will be enforced and there will be a one year waiting period before they are eligible to receive a sponsor certificate

It is the responsibility of the sponsor to obtain a Sponsor Certificate from their home parish, including sponsors from Saint Theresa Parish.

Faith sharing prompts

For Confirmation candidates and sponsors

You have already selected your sponsor, someone with whom you have a special relationship. Your sponsor is someone who can be a spiritual mentor to you as you learn more about your faith and develop an ever closer relationship to our Lord.

Over the next few months, you will engage in some faith-based conversations with your sponsor. You may communicate by phone, in person, or by email, depending on your individual circumstances. You should ask the sponsor the question and listen carefully to the answer. You should then share your response to the question with your sponsor.

Things to remember:

--These questions are only a starting point, so feel free to use them as a springboard to other faith topics!

--**You do not need to write any responses**; just listen carefully and speak sincerely.

--Do not attempt to answer all the questions in one session...it is better to break them up and to give yourself time to reflect on what was discussed.

--Record the date and method of communication. You, your sponsor, and your parent, sign this paper as witness to the completion of the sessions.



Christian Service

Throughout 7th and continuing in 8th grade, those preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation are to seek out ways to show Christian love and care in their homes and community, following Jesus' command to love God and to love your neighbor as yourself on an on-going basis.

There are not a specific number of hours of service required for each confirmand, rather they are asked to identify opportunities for service in their families, schools, and communities and incorporate service into their lives.

Listed below are some suggested service activities based on the **Corporal Works of Mercy**:

Spiritual Works of Mercy: The Spiritual Works of Mercy are kind acts by which we help our neighbors with their everyday spiritual and emotional needs. Some examples are:

Instructing - Commit yourself to learning about the Catholic Faith and share your understanding of the faith with others and with those who welcome it

Advising - Respond to negative and prejudicial comments with positive statements; put an end to gossip by walking away; set a good example to others

Consoling- Work at being optimistic and avoiding cynicism; ask people about their hopes and support them in trying to attain them

Comforting- Offer words of encouragement to those who seem discouraged; offer positive words to fellow students who are having a difficult time with their tasks; offer sympathy to those who are grieving

Forgiving- Pray for those who have wronged you and pray for the courage to forgive; ask forgiveness from others; let go of grudges; go out of your way to be positive with someone you are having a difficult time with

Bearing wrongs patiently- Work at being less critical of others; overlook minor flaws and mistakes; pray for those who have wronged you

The confirmand may choose to take a new Confirmation name or may choose to use his/her baptismal name (first or middle) for Confirmation. The chosen name must be a Saint's name or a name in Christian tradition, such as a biblical name.

Using the baptismal name at Confirmation serves as a link between the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Choosing a new saint's name allows the confirmand to adopt a new patron or to honor a saint to whom he/she has a special devotion.

It is important that the candidates know the relationship of the name to Christian religious tradition.

Catholic Devotions

The confirmation candidates are asked to attend a minimum of 7 different Catholic devotions during the two year preparation program. These devotions can include but are not limited to: A Holy Hour at Adoration, 40 Hours, Stations of the Cross, the Rosary, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Holy Thursday Mass, Good Friday liturgy, a parish mission, vespers, a Holy Hour, a novena, a pilgrimage.

The Letter to the Pastor

Prior to Confirmation, the candidate will present a letter written to Father Sahd expressing his/her desire to be confirmed and willingness to make this commitment. The letter should be written or typed neatly and can include the following:

Introduce yourself and share some information about yourself, such as your family, your interests and hobbies, a little about your background, and your current faith practices.

State that you would like to receive the sacrament of Confirmation and explain why you want to be confirmed. It may help you to think about the ways in which this sacrament will strengthen your relationship with Jesus, the role of faith in your life, or what it means to you to be a part of the parish community of Saint Theresa Parish.

Conclude with your expectations as to how the sacrament will impact your life both now and in the future.

Final Preparation

For proximate preparation, a Penance Service, group gathering, practice and prayer service will be scheduled in the fall immediately prior to the date of Confirmation. The Bishop also requests letters from the candidates, instruction for those will be given about a month prior to the date of Confirmation.
