We are writing to provide you with a brief update from our elementary ELA programming and important information regarding summer reading.

Bookworms Literacy Program: Pilot Wrap-Up & What's Next

This school year, our K–5 classrooms piloted the *Bookworms* literacy program, and we're excited to share that the pilot has officially concluded. Based on strong teacher feedback and promising student outcomes, we'll be moving to full implementation of Bookworms across all elementary grades next year.

Why Bookworms?

Students responded enthusiastically to the program—especially having their own books! Teachers reported significant gains in reading comprehension, vocabulary, writing confidence, and overall engagement with texts. The structured, consistent routines helped all learners thrive, and the program fosters a genuine love of reading.

How You Can Help This Summer

Research shows that reading every day significantly increases a child's reading ability. The books selected for Trumbull's Summer Reading Program are chosen to make reading an enjoyable part of your child's life and your support is essential. You can make our program successful by the positive attitude you take toward reading and by the encouragement you show your child.

To assist you in supporting your child, the Office of Teaching & Learning recommends that you:

Record the number of books read in a reading log as your child reads throughout the summer. Every book counts for the Governor's Challenge and your home school. Schools with the highest participation and number of books read will be recognized by the state.
