Action Items

- Approval of Minutes, Minutes approved and seconded.
 - February 13, 2024 Voted on and approved
- University Council Bias Resolution With recent bias incidents occurring a proposed resolution to University Council and condemned the recent bias incidents. Motion to move forward. Motion to move (Jeff), Second (Jordan). Discussion Nathan, Condemning things that we don't know what happened, in some cases it has been used in a broader context to hurt students. A broader statement of EOU on bias incidents in general. Specific incidents will probably not be detailed, but stand in solidarity with students/staff going through these incidents. Moved forward for a vote. Resolution was passed.
- 4.10.40 AI, AGI, and Machine Learning TRACKED (Jeff Carman) 4.10.40 - AI, AGI, and Machine Learning CLEAN Moved for discussion (Jordan), Second (Robert), Discussion - Question about purpose - Purpose of policy to establish responsibility for different units - Provost for faculty, IT for Admin. This along with Informational Security. Section E-instructional, E-1 is institutional. The policy does help in terms of trying to address issues beforehand, otherwise could be exposed for damages. Instructional use was written by the Provost and several changes made by the Provost. Is this the usage guideline? This was also discussed by EPCC. Gives Faculty broad usage of AI, but it does need to be mentioned in the syllabus. Student Affairs is working on a similar process that is directed at students. Some discussion of the usage by AI in terms of power/electricity. Put to a vote - Passed.
- 4.10.60 Information Security TRACKED (Jeff Carman)
 4.10.60 Information Security CLEAN Moved for discussion (Nathan), Second (Robert). Discussion a lot of this was housekeeping, cleaning up grammar. Put to a vote Passed.
- X.XX.XX Naloxone Deployment and Administration Policy (Jim Hoffman) Bring forward for discussion (Andy), Second (Timothy). Select training right now, there will be a more robust rolling out of training later. Discussion If you are not trained you can still use the deployment of the Narcan. Narcan is covered by Good Samaritan Law. Where it is stored may need to be revisited as it is ingested. There is a difference in the way it is administered, it is done nasally and that is not done as an ingested drug. Also a stop gap procedure. Will

probably need to be closely monitored. This is more a policy about having it on campus to understand the need for Narcan on campus. Put to a vote - Passed.

Information Items

- ASEOU Update (ASEOU) Elections are underway. Two candidates for Pres. Six for Senate. Two write-ins. Working on elections and the transition time.
- <u>Faculty Senate Update</u> (E. Sharratt) Discussion about the Common Course Numbering courses (Z courses). There was concern about pulling off the items but in the end it was passed. Went through the next group of courses that will be considered. Gen Ed subcommittee discussed findings and comparisons with other schools. Will bring back more information on the Gen Ed, how it is working, is it too much, etc. Questions about the Gen Ed subcommittee - it is just a subcommittee by the Faculty Senate. Looking at how students are impacted. Looking into the data.
- 5.25.15 Sick Leave Policy-Donation Amendment (C. McLaughlin) Changes were discussed. Originated from a faculty member. Hope that it is plain and clear. Discussion does this donated sick leave go into a pot or can it be directed. It can only be directed to a certain individual. It will not go into a pot. Actively supported by Dr. Ryan. Question about transfer and termination If you leave you do not take your sick leave with you but if you return within two years you get that returned to you. Carries across classifications? Yes. This will be voted on next time.
