Step 1: Review of Wikipedia statement on acceptable sources

I didn't want to choose a topic any of y'all have chosen but I wanted to choose something that might be a good contemporary comparison.

TRIGGER WARNING: My topic is the <u>Central Park Jogger case</u> in which 5 teenagers were wrongfully convicted of the violent rape and assault of a jogger in Central Park in 1989. I choose this case because the Wikipedia article leaves a lot to be discussed. I will not be showing any pictures or descriptions of the crime beyond a brief scan of a few newspaper articles where I will be demonstrating how to add to your list of keywords to use in future searches.

Step 2: Read through the existing wikipedia article and find names and dates to help you with your future search.

2.1 Collect the names of people involved in the event. You can scan the present Wikipedia article to start with, or a primary source item such as a newspaper article or a feature article in a magazine, references in a book, etc. Be sure to list all the names just in case one of them is useful either as a search term or for corroborating your information during the research process!

Step 3: Search using Proquest Newspapers (linked in the LibGuide)

- 3.1 I started by searching for the first name in my names list, "Antron McCray." I used this as a keyword in the search field and I set my pre-search limiters to "April 19, 1989 to April 30, 1989." Once I did my search, I filtered my results by selecting the New York TImes, since that is a local newspaper for my event. My goal was to locate first accounts of the crime.
- 3.2 After I scanned these results, I did a new search using the keywords "Central Park" and limiting to "July 1 1990 August 30, 1990." These dates encompass the two trials that took place. Once again, I applied the filter "New York Times" to my results.
- 3.3 As I scanned the titles of articles during the trial, I noticed a lot of articles citing errors in the police handling of evidence including unmatched bio samples and possible defendant coercion, in addition to racial profiling.
- 3.4 After noticing this, I went back to Wikipedia to scan the existing article for inclusion of these items and decided that this would be where I focus my efforts if I were revising this article.

 - I am going to enter the dates 07/01/1990 12/30/1990.
 - I am going to limit to legal cases in the state of NY.
 - I used the keywords "Central park" jogger (I put jogger outside of the parentheses because i want the search engine to be able to find that work in conjunction with the phrase "central park" rather than limiting to the full phrase "central park jogger.")
