



# Recycling Bin

Did You Know . . .

The most recycled material in the world is steel - from industrial and commercial construction. Our own Association's former resident/owner and sculptress extraordinaire, Cat Tweedie-Ball, found a whimsical way to re-use construction waste for all our benefit, beautifully repurposing it into bike racks and a planter, 'Strong Woman.'

The U.S. generates 66 million tons of recycled waste annually, one-third of which was, until last January, processed in China, which stopped accepting our recyclable waste then. Several Pacific northwest communities in Oregon and Washington have been forced to divert as much as 20% of their recyclables to landfills while they search for alternative processors.



#### What's Your Recycling Conundrum?

Scott With Stuff writes: We're trying to declutter and need to get rid of a bunch of still usable items. What options are out there?

Dear Scott with Stuff,

#### FREECYCLE IT AT WWW.FREECYCLE.ORG!

The only prohibitions (besides selling stuff) are pets, food/compost and services, though each group (Cambridge, Wellesley, Somerville, Medford - you get the idea) has its own rules, such as whether you can post links and/or photos. Sometimes, you need a photo hosting site, like the iCloud, to post pictures. You sign up through <u>Freecycle.org</u> using your Yahoo! account.

On the right-hand side of the main page you'll see a tab marked 'Your Posts.' Click that, and it'll take you to a page that shows your posts, which also contains a link to 'Make a Post.' Click that, and you'll be sent to a page with a .php that asks you to select from a drop-down menu whether your item is a 'WANTED' item, or an 'OFFER.' Then, select the group you want to post to from the next drop-down menu, describe the item briefly in the title, and further describe it in the description box below.

Items that contain dimensions and color and attach links to photos go quicker than those that don't. You'll receive an email to your Yahoo! email account from people who wish to claim the item, with whom you arrange a convenient time and day for pick up - usually, off your front porch. Avoid back stories on your posts, such as 'My brother finally got his own place, but he left a bunch of his old gaming

equipment he no longer wants, and I need the stuff gone,' and don't include your contact info., but if you want stuff gone quickly state that earliest responders will get preference.

You can sign up to get posts individually, as they're made, or get one 'digest' post at the end of the day. Each has its benefits. If you're a student in need of a whole kitchen full of wares, getting a lot of emails quickly might be better than a digest since other students new to the area are likely doing the same thing, while if you're looking for, say, Joni Mitchell vinyl, probably a digest would work.

<u>www.trashnothing.com</u> aggregates local freecyling groups' posts in one inbox and easily allows you to post pictures of your items without using an outside photo hosting site.

#### And for those choice items . . .

If you're in no hurry to get rid of choice items, such as turntables, you might want to consider converting them into contributions for your favorite charity, such as Somerville Elder Services, by posting it on <a href="letgo.com">letgo.com</a> using their handy-dandy app. Make the item a reasonable price to catch more people's attention, if you anticipate posting more items.

That's a great win-win-win-win for you, your charity of choice, bargain hunters and our planet.

#### Don't forget . . .

Garden cleanup generates lots of leaves and grass clippings, which can be bagged in lawn and leaf bags and left for city pick up Monday mornings with the regular trash now through December, while houseplants may be composted year-round.

#### And finally . . .

When polled recently about the weirdest thing Association residents have, or have seen, recycled/reused, random responses included a commode, which was freecycled to a person anticipating post-surgical convalescence and a size 28 pair of Levi's with a wife beater, also freecycled.
