

STUDENT CONTRACT OF EXPECTATIONS

TO BE A SUCCESSFUL ONLINE STUDENT...

- I understand that I must have adequate computer and technical skills.
- I understand I must have the ability to stay engaged in the virtual course by establishing a schedule that has sufficient time to do the course work each day – and I will make this schedule a priority.
- I will be expected to engage in virtual courses either by participating in the course “live” (synchronous) or by viewing content and engaging with educators and peers at a later time. (asynchronous)
- I will keep track of all course deadlines, pacing guides and other expectations.
- I will check email and AE feedback from Salina Virtual on a daily basis (24-hour rule)
- I will model ethical behavior by honoring USD 305's Academic Honesty Policy.
- I understand I will not copy and paste information into documents and submit that work as my original thoughts and ideas. This includes using Artificial Intelligence software or applications.
- I understand that if I engage in unethical academic practices (copying, cheating, turning in work that is not my own), I will face disciplinary action.
- I will inform my instructor in a timely manner if I am experiencing difficulties in my courses.
- I will inform the Principal of any scheduled or unscheduled absences and make up work as required.
- I will exhibit appropriate etiquette while communicating with my peers and online instructors.
- I will use school equipment in compliance with the USD 305 Acceptable Use Policy.
- I understand that I am required to take all mandatory state/district assessments.
- I understand that I must create my individual plan of study (IPS) through Xello activities and career plans
- I understand the KS State Board of Education mandates two count days which require students to work 360 minutes on the online platform each of the two days. These days will be scheduled and communicated by SVIA.
- I understand that I will log 30 hours each full school week (or 6 hours/day for school weeks less than 5 full days in length). Available time to log hours begins each Monday and ends at 11:59 p.m. on Sunday evening.
- Failure to make academic progress and/or maintain regular attendance may result in denial of future enrollment, academic probation and/or truancy.
