* In addition to their daily ELA assignments, it is recommended that first-grade students engage in independent reading each day. Independent reading is when students choose their own reading material, and read on their own, with minimal support. The more time children spend reading independently, the more they improve as readers. Experts tell us that children should be reading independently, in books at their appropriate or "just-right" reading level, every day for at least 15-30 minutes.
