

The Human Behavioral Ecology Bibliography (HBEB)

The **Human Behavioral Ecology Bibliography** is a listing of publications in the area of [human behavioral ecology](#), from 2000 to the present, helping those of us working in this area keep up with each other's publications. The HBEB was created and maintained by [Kermyt G. Anderson](#) from 2003 - 2013.

After a long hiatus, I have resuscitated the Human Behavioral Ecology Bibliography as an editable google document. Feel free to add any relevant citations for human behavioral ecology, especially from 2013 onward. (There are over 1400 pubs listed here – but only about 300 for the past six years.) Feel free to share this link with colleagues or students.

Now that the HBEB is open-sourced, it's only going to be as good as the information its users supply. Thanks in advance for your help in keeping this up date!

- **Note:** if anyone wants to go cull appropriate papers from the past several years of *Human Nature*, *Evolution and Human Behavior*, *Current Anthropology*, and *American Journal of Human Biology* (which together t roughly $\frac{2}{3}$ of HBE papers, according to Nettle et al. 2013) – that would be greatly appreciated!

You'll note that there isn't a consistent reference formatting across the entries. Just enter what you've got, in your preferred format. We'll favor substance over form.

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There is also a BibTex version of this bibliography (put together by Elly Power (epower AT santafe DOT edu), with the help of text2bib), which you can use to import all of these citations into your personal citation database manager (EndNote, Zotero, Mendeley, JabRef, whatever). Bret Beheim has done [some analysis of the HBEB database](#). He's got graphs of pubs per year; author frequency; a word cloud of the words appearing in article titles; etc. Pretty nifty!
