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1. THESIS SUMMARY

Based on theoretical and practical issues regarding the economic sector's structure and its transition to meet the requirements of industrialization and modernization, this thesis has analyzed and evaluated the economic structure transition in the Key Southern Economic Region from 2010 to 2021. It identifies the achieved results, limitations, and causes of these limitations in the process of economic structure transition. Consequently, the thesis proposes viewpoints, orientations, and solutions to promote the economic sector's structural transformation in the Key Southern Economic Region by 2030, meeting the requirements of industrialization and modernization.

Apart from the introduction and conclusion, the content of the thesis is presented in four chapters:

Chapter 1: Overview of research on the economic structure transition to meet the requirements of industrialization and modernization.

Chapter 2: Theoretical foundation of the economic structure transition in the Key Southern Economic Region to meet the requirements of industrialization and modernization.

Chapter 3: The economic structure transition in the Key Southern Economic Region from 2010 to 2021 in response to industrialization and modernization requirements.

Chapter 4: Main solutions to promote the economic structure transition in the Key Southern Economic Region, meeting the requirements of industrialization and modernization.

2. NEW RESULTS OF THE THESIS

The thesis has systematized the theory of the economic structure transition to meet the requirements of industrialization and modernization in a key economic region of Vietnam from a political-economic perspective. It generalizes the criteria for evaluating the economic structure transition and analyzes the factors influencing the economic structure transition in a region to meet the requirements of industrialization and modernization.

Based on the analysis and evaluation of the resources, dynamics, and level of economic structure transition in the Key Southern Economic Region from 2010 to 2021, the thesis provides an overall picture of the economic structure transition in this region. It identifies the achieved results, existing limitations, and the causes of these limitations during the economic structure transition in the Key Southern Economic Region.

Considering the characteristics of the Key Southern Economic Region, as well as the current opportunities and challenges, the thesis proposes feasible directions and solutions to promote the economic structure transition in the region to meet the requirements of industrialization and modernization in the future.

3. APPLICATIONS/ THEIR POSSIBLE USES IN PRACTICE OR ISSUES THAT NEED CONTINUED RESEARCH

With the research results, the thesis contributes valuable to the local authorities, departments, and sectors of the Key Southern Economic Region. It is a valuable reference for managers, researchers, and students interested in economic structural transformation and its transition. However, due to limited research resources and the broad scope of the topic on the economic structure transition in a region, which cannot be fully covered in this thesis, future research directions might include: (1) Developing resources in the Key Southern Economic Region to promote the economic structure transition towards industrialization and modernization; (2) Studying the connection between regional linkage policies and the economic structure transition in the Key Southern Economic Region.
