Express Reports

President

Richard presented a verbal report. He spoke at the RIMPA roadshow, which Michael chaired.

This has been made more difficult with changes in the Incorporated Societies as well as Kiwibanks own requirements. Michael has almost completed all the steps and is about to send a letter to Evan and Jenni for them to request that their names be withdrawn as signatories.

Richard has been reaching out to our branches to see how we as Council can assist them, and what challenges they are facing. He believes this is a very important part of our activities.

Richard acknowledged the passing of Life Member Tom Wilstead and thanked those involved in preparing a brief statement for our website. He added that Stuart Strachan will be writing a fuller obituary for *Archifacts*. The family were very appreciative of the comments made by members.

As stated in the correspondence, Richard was approached by NZHA in reference to a possible history council. Richard believes it is a very positive step and that the more kindred groups work together the better. He looks forward to participating in a proposed meeting in the future.

Records management

General Business

Transfer of ARANZ records from the Beaglehole Library to Hocken Collections, Dunedin

Tom said that Hocken is not in a position to accept them. He will contact Alexander Turnbull to see if they may accept them. Richard offered to contact them on our behalf.

Conference 2024 Scholarship

After some discussion it was decided that ARANZ will offer 5 scholarships to the Conference. Two at least will be for student members. Richard, Michael and Paul will work on the details and get back to Council as soon as practicable.

Bookkeeper role

Resolution: That ARANZ seek indicative costs from the company BookAssist and share whatever information is required, with the intention of contracting BookAssist to provide bookkeeping services on an ongoing basis.

Resolution: That ARANZ enter into a contract with BookAssist, to provide services in line with those previously approved by the Council, if the ongoing costs are expected to average less than \$325 + GST.

Resolution: That ARANZ use BookAssist's accounting solution, which would mean storing our accounts on a server operated by BookAssist, noting that:

- *Copies of all financial information could be exported and received at any time,*
- *An approved ARANZ member could access these accounts remotely,*
- *Costs of this server usage are included in BookAssist's fees, and*
- *BookAssist state that their customer's information is logically separated, so ARANZ financial information would not be accessible by other BookAssist customers.*

Richard / Michael Agreed.

Michael will continue to discuss this matter with BookAssist
