
Country overview: ESTONIA




Estonia has 1,3 million people Language spoken: Estonian

Education system

- ~550 schools
- ~14 900 teachers
- ~147 000 students in basic to gymnasium level
- Schools divide: governmental schools (usually gymnasiums), local authority schools (basic schools and gymnasiums), and there are also some independent schools (basic schools and gymnasiums)
- Mandatory education up to 9th grade
- 70% of students choose after 9th grade to go to gymnasium and 30% vocational education
- Schools have great level of autonomy example to develop their own curriculum, hire teachers etc.
- School starts at 1.09 and ends around 12.06. Estonia has five school breaks (every semester last 6 weeks, summer holiday 2,5 months). Grading up to 6th grade can be descriptive (school decides). In the curriculum is stated the overall rules and regulations how to give education in Estonia.
