# **Expectations for Band Students**

- A desire to learn music and make friends with students across the district
- An ability to attend Tuesday night practices from 5:15-6:30pm (not every week)
- A commitment to practice their instrument outside of class at least 1 hour each week
- A willingness to work diligently during class time to the best of their ability
- The understanding band is a full year commitment and a graded course



# What is the SD60 Band Program?

Band is *primarily an in school course*, taught twice per week in the school day to smaller classes of 30. Classes are held M/Th or Tue/F during school hours. During the students' required fine arts time, they are bused to Margaret "Ma" Murray Community School, or to Anne Roberts Young Elementary School for the opportunity to learn an instrument from a professional music educator. Each of these new schools have a professionally designed room specifically meant for music.

There is also a night band component to this course, which is held Tuesday nights. These classes for the majority of the year are instrument based, with all Flutes coming in one week, all Saxophones the next, and so on. Grade 6 students are not required to attend every Tuesday, only the ones that they are specifically scheduled for. We do have some mass rehearsals in the last few weeks prior to our concerts and Festival performances.

### What is the commitment?

Once per week on Tuesdays from 5:15-6:30pm, students gather together at the Anne Roberts, or Ma Murray band room to play as a full band. Some weeks not all instruments are required, and a complete schedule will be sent home during the summer. Students are also required to attend two kickoff events: "Squeak and Squawk"

(https://tinyurl.com/SD60BandSqeak) and the "Beginner Retreat" (https://tinyurl.com/SD60BandRetreat) where older band students and community members give them private and small group instruction to get them the



best possible start. Students are also expected to practice for 20 minutes, 3 times per week outside of class time. Once classes start in the fall, band is expected to be a year-long commitment. Like sports, the evening commitments increase as students age.



# Where will the band take my child?

The band program has much local and national acclaim, with numerous gold and silver awards. The band has been to the invite-only MusicFest Canada several years in a row. Past trips have included Ottawa, Cuba, and New York City! Beginners perform two large concerts at the North Peace Cultural Centre per year, as well as smaller school performances. Several former SD60 Band students have gone on to find careers in music.

### What is the cost?

Band is a free course, but students are required to purchase a music book (\$20), and maintenance materials (\$10-20) for their instrument. Instruments can be rented, rent-to own, or bought. Shirts are available to students but optional. The instrument company Sight and Sound travels to Fort St. John each September at "Squeak and Squawk" and that is when students rent their instruments. Most instruments are about \$20/month, but some are more. Financial assistance is available upon request.

# What do students learn in SD60 Band?

# From the BC Ministry of Education:

All BC students must work on the following three core competencies each yeah, and participation in the Band Program covers all three.

**Communication** — Music is a universal language. Musicians engage with each other as well as the audience to convey ideas and emotions. Music, like other languages can be passed on aurally through listening, or by reading written notation.



**Thinking** — When playing in a musical ensemble, students are constantly evaluating their own playing and how it fits into the sounds others are making. MRI scans have shown that a musician's brain has all regions of their brain active at once when playing music. <a href="https://tinvurl.com/SD60BandBrainOnMusic">https://tinvurl.com/SD60BandBrainOnMusic</a>

**Personal and Social** — Playing in band makes a student a part of a team. Students learn their actions matter, and they learn how to lift each other up as they strive towards a common purpose. Students also learn to lift each other up as they work towards personal goals related to their individual musicianship.

### The main goals in our SD60 Framework for the Enhancement of Student Learning:

- Goal 1: Increase Dogwood Completion Rates
- Goal 2: Increase Student Social/Emotional Competency
- Goal 3: Enhance Student Options Through Diverse Learning Experiences in Career Education
- Goal 4: Support Student Achievement Through a Systemic Learning Support Model

### Participation in the SD60 Band Program helps achieve these goals:

- 1. Band is a chance to achieve individually and as part of a community. If students are part of a team, they are more likely to stay in school.
- 2. Playing in a band requires students to be constantly engaged in a dynamic process that uses the full brain in a social context.
- 3. Music education is a requirement and/or asset to many career paths both involving music and those that do not for example, medical schools like the discipline and fine motor skills musicians develop.
- 4. The band program is a close-knit community where students work with the same teachers for many years. Band teachers offer many curricular and extracurricular opportunities to support students socially, emotionally and musically.
