eclipsed	deprive (someone or something) of significance, power, or prominence.
prevailed	prove more powerful than opposing forces; be victorious
spewing	expel large quantities of (something) rapidly and forcibly.
supplant	supersede and replace.: "another discovery could supplant the original finding".
accorded	give or grant someone (power, status, or recognition).: "the powers accorded to the head of state"
idolatry	the worship of idols.
exuberance	the quality of being full of energy, excitement, and cheerfulness; ebullience.: "a sense of youthful exuberance".
acclamation	loud and enthusiastic approval, typically to welcome or honor someone or something.: "the tackle brought the fans to their feet in acclamation".
segregation	the action or state of setting someone or something apart from other people or things or being set apart
hostile	unfriendly; antagonistic.: "a hostile audience" "he wrote a ferociously hostile attack".
racism	prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism directed against a person or people on the basis of their membership in a particular racial or ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized

integrate	bring (people or groups with particular characteristics or needs) into equal participation in or membership of a social group or institution.: "integrating children with special needs into ordinary schools".
