Grammar

The Plural is no longer productive, and the paucal shifts as the new plural

Only Ergative, Absolutive, Genitive, Dative have been preserved separately

Word Order is free but tends to VSO

Evidentiality markers preserved

Lexicon

Mostly inherited from Proto-Atlantean or borrowed from other branches.

Some words borrowed from substrate languages.

High Kyrran

Consonant shift: all intervocalic stops lenite, all intervocalic prenasalized stops become regular stops

Vowel Inventory: Stays the same

Evidentiality Markers preserved

Lexically Conservative: no borrowings
