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Abstract

Abstract in English with 150 – 250 words, including a minimum of 3 keywords and a maximum of 5. The abstract should cover important aspects related to the article, including objectives, research methods, population and sample/object of research, research instruments, and research results.

Keywords: each word separated by commas (,)

Introduction

This template should be used as a formatting and layout guide for articles to be published in the conference proceedings. Authors are required to adhere to all writing rules, including font type, size, layout, word count, structure, and citation style. The introduction should primarily contain the reasons for conducting the research, supported by a theoretical literature review. The introduction is expected to include as many citations from scientific journals (preferably reputable international journals) as possible. Technically, authors can fully use this template by replacing its content section by section, ensuring the submitted article meets the expected guidelines. This section should describe at least 3 (three) novel aspects of the research compared to previous journals and research questions.

Methodology

This section should explain the research methodology used, including the implementation procedures. The tools, materials, media, or research instruments must be clearly described. If statistical formulas are part of the methodology, general formulas should not be written.

Results and Discussion

Subsection Title 1

This section explains the research results in detail, including presenting calculation results, needs analysis, etc. Research results can also be displayed in tables or figures, provided that tables or figures are not too long, too large, or too numerous. Authors should use variations in presenting tables or figures, and each table or figure presented must be referred to (not rewritten) in the text. Tables resulting from SPSS data processing should not be included in the article; instead, authors should summarize and create their own tables according to the format required in this template.
