NOTES

- All Business majors need to take either BUS 225 or BUS 230. BUS 230 can be used as an elective only if a student has also taken BUS 225.
- All Business majors need to enroll in the Professional Development Program for career preparedness every semester starting in their sophomore year. While this course carries no credit hours, its completion is required for graduation.
- Experiential Learning (one of): BUS 488: Consulting Practicum , BUS 489: Internship, BUS 499: Undergraduate Research, Study Abroad Course
- Social Science Core requirement is met by any BUS course.
- Foundations of American Democracy requirement is met by BUS 300.
- Quantitative Reasoning requirement is met by STAT 185 or STAT 225.
- All required courses in Major are offered each academic year.
- Refer to the current catalog for the frequency of the elective course offerings.
- General electives can be taken at any time in consultation with your academic advisor.
- Students interested in a Finance minor can double dip up to 8 credit hours (ECON 103 and 306) leaving 12 additional credit hours to take to get the minor. Possible courses include ECON 174 (Intro to Finance, recommended to take before ECON 306 to build a stronger foundation), ECON 342 (required for the minor), ACCT 301, ECON 305, or another 4 credit hour elective that satisfies the minor requirements.
- Students interested in an Accounting minor can take ACCT 301 and two more classes from among ACCT 302, ACCT 317, ACCT 342, or ACCT 417 to get the minor.
- Students interested in an Economics minor can take 3 additional courses in Economics to get the minor.
