

As we decide on priorities to take on as a coalition, we will discuss the following questions:

Where did this project come from?

1. What community needs does this project address?
 - a. Who identified those needs? Are they the self-identified priorities of impacted communities of color? Disability community? Other impacted communities?
 - b. How do we know that?
2. Who is currently working on this project? Are we working with BIPOC communities?

Impacts of this project:

3. Who benefits from this project?
 - a. What are those benefits? (material, power, community, etc.)
 - b. Is this a power-building opportunity?
 - i. For the MASS coalition? For impacted communities?
4. What could be some potential negative impacts of this project?
 - a. Who is burdened by those negative impacts?
5. Is there any community or organization that might have a strong opinion on this project that we haven't heard from?

City goals and resources:

6. Is this campaign or project pushing Seattle towards its stated racial equity goals (<http://rsji.org/>), or is this campaign or project furthering other forms of equity? (Age, language, ethnicity, gender, race, ability, wealth, immigration status)
 - a. For who, in what way, and on what timeline?
 - b. Does this campaign impact people who have been displaced outside of Seattle?
7. Is this project using resources or energy that could be more equitably focused? (other transportation projects or other broader City needs)
 - a. Are there other potential sources of funding that could be leveraged?

MASS goals and resources:

8. What is our goal?
 - a. As the larger campaign
 - b. As MASS coalition
9. Who is currently doing the work associated with this project (time, energy, expertise, resources)?
 - a. Is that work equitably distributed?
 - b. What is the benefit of MASS taking on this project?
 - c. What work will be required if MASS takes on this project?
 - i. Who will be doing that work? (actually assign people)
10. Based on the discussion above, what are the elements we would need to prioritize?
11. Based on the discussion above, what are pitfalls we would need to make sure we avoid?

Measurables and Accountability:

12. How are we ensuring accountability, and to who or to what community?
 - a. What is MASS's accountability to communities who have been working on this, or those who identified the initial needs?
 - b. How is the city building accountability into their process and implementation?
13. How do we plan to be accountable to the communities doing the work and make sure that our work on this amplifies but doesn't overshadow or erase?
