# District Finance Update

- Month End Report: ½ way through school year, this is our lowest fiscal position of the year as we are waiting for property taxes to come in.
- Total Revenue compared to last year down \$2500 from last year due to personal property tax delinquencies and Columbia gas delayed tax payment
- Expenses down from last year
- Cost Savings
  - Reduced trash bill by \$8k
  - Reduced phone bills by \$20k this year and 40k in future years
  - Katie Talbott family donated a bus to the district
  - Moving banking from 5/3 to Signature bank to reduce expenditures
    - In total saved \$101k, which will increase to \$125k annually

- Heather reviewed expenses document and highlighted key years
- Discussed ways to reduce expenses (closet for band/choir)
- AP Classes: have an additional fee associated for the AP exam fee tests (not a school fee, but an AP fee). Students can opt out of the AP exam, and the fee would be waived.
- Heather provided an example of how she uses this for her family (her kids are in 6th, 8th, and 10th grades)
