Connecticut Color Breed Association Inc. (CCBA): Bylaws

A. MISSION STATEMENT

a. The Connecticut Color Breed Association was established for the promotion of quality horses, ponies, miniatures and longears with color. All equines, no matter the size or breeding, can participate in a variety of classes and programs for every level of horseman.

B. GENERAL RULES

- a. 5 horse shows per calendar year
- b. Should the Board of Directors deem it necessary to cancel or reschedule any horse show, notification will be made using the web site and/or facebook
- c. CCBA horse show year runs November 1st to October 31st. All points must be earned during this time. You will have a grace period of 15 days to get all your points into the club.
- d. You do not need to be a member of CT Color Breed Association to show but you must be a member for your points to accumulate and count towards year end awards.
- e. Adult is considered 19 yrs and up as of Jan 1 of current calendar year, Junior is 18 years and under as of Jan 1 of current calendar year.
- f. CCBA is held on private property. CCBA and Glastonbury Hunt Club reserve the right to refuse show entries or service to individuals deemed acting inappropriate in nature or breaking CCBA club rules.
- g. CCBA, its employees and Board of Directors are available to assist with CCBA questions only, and may not be able to assist you with what class level is appropriate for you and your horse. For training for riding specific questions, we encourage you to speak to a trainer or instructor.

C. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- a. President
 - i. This role is appointed by the current Board of Directors
- b. Vice President
 - i. This role is appointed by the current Board of Directors
- c. Secretary
 - i. May also noted as Membership Secretary
 - ii. This role is optional
- d. Treasurer
 - . Should no Treasurer be appointed, the President shall take on the role

D. MEMBERSHIP

- a. There are no formal membership meetings
- b. Applications of proposed new membership, along with the proper fee, shall be submitted to CCBA in writing. Upon acceptance the applicant shall immediately become a member entitled to all the rights and privileges afforded any member in good standing.
- c. A member, who has dropped from the active membership roll for any reason, in order to become reinstated, shall make out a new membership application along with proper fee.
- d. Membership fees are neither transferable nor refundable
- e. CCBA also reserves the right to demand an up front payment from anyone that has left the show grounds without paying their bill. This payment shall be in the form of cash.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- A. CCBA year runs November 1st to October 31st. All points must be earned during this time. You will have a grace period of 15 days to get all your points into the club.
- B. CCBA, any Affiliate Association, and the horse show facility reserve the right to refuse show entries or service to individuals deemed acting inappropriate in nature, breaking CCBA rules, Affiliate Association rules, or for any other reason.
- C. CCBA, its employees and Board of Directors are available to assist with CCBA questions only, and may not be able to assist you with what class level is appropriate for you and your horse. For training for riding specific questions, we encourage you to speak to a trainer or instructor.

D. Release of Liability

a. CCBA and co-sponsoring organizations, if any, shall not be responsible for any personal injury, or for loss or damage to property, occurring at any CCBA activity. Each owner, exhibitor, handler, or consignor shall indemnify and hold harmless CCBA, Affiliate Associations, its officers, directors and employees from and against all claims, demands, causes of actions, and expenses of every kind, including attorney's fees, arising out of or related in any manner to the acts or omissions of an owner, exhibitor, handler, or consignor, or the actions of any animal under the care, custody, or control of the owner, exhibitor, handler or consignor. Presentation of signed entry or consignment forms shall be deemed acceptance of the conditions of this rule. In the event an entry or consignment form is not signed or presented, appearance on the grounds of any CCBA or Affiliate Association activity as an exhibitor, handler, owner, or consignor shall be deemed to be acceptance of the conditions of this rule.

E. Membership

- a. Membership of CCBA is a privilege, not a right. Membership may be revoked at any time for miscount or conduct unbecoming of a member.
- b. Adult is considered 19 yrs and up as of Jan 1 of current calendar year
- c. Junior is 18 years and under as of Jan 1 of current calendar year.
 - Juniors may register as adult members if they are turning 19 between November 1st and December 31st of the CCBA year.
- d. Each Junior membership must be accompanied by an adult membership.
- e. Joint membership is any 2 adult individuals living at the same residence. This includes but is not limited to: roommates, couples, and relatives.
- f. Membership allows an individual to qualify and receive year end awards in all shows and programs.

F. Inhumane Treatment

- a. No person shall treat any horse in an inhumane manner. This prohibition against inhumane treatment applies to CCBA members and nonmembers.
- b. For purposes of this rule, a person responsible for the care of a horse is also responsible for and may be disciplined for the inhumane conduct of their trainers, agents, representatives and employees. For violation of this rule, an individual may be disciplined, suspended, fined, disqualified, expelled from show grounds and/or expelled from CCBA.
- c. CCBA may also temporarily suspend an individual charged or indicted pursuant to state, federal, provincial or international law for an offense of cruelty or inhumane treatment of a horse, whether or not the equine in question has a connection to CCBA or not. Such temporary suspension will remain in place or may pending the outcome of the legal proceedings made basis of the charge or indictment and may become permanent at that time.
- d. Inhumane treatment of any horse or any other animal on show grounds is strictly prohibited. Treatment of any horse will be considered inhumane if the show steward, or a person, educated or experienced in accepted equine training techniques, would perceive the conduct of an individual to be inhumane.
- e. A list of suspended individuals will be emailed to each affiliate association as they are updated.

G. Unsportsmanlike Conduct

- a. Any form of misconduct that is irresponsible, illegal, indecent, profane, intimidating, threatening or abusive is prohibited. This provision applies to CCBA members, affiliate association members, nonmembers, exhibitors, trainers, owners, owner representatives, spectators and all other persons on the show grounds or at a CCBA event.
- b. Show management may immediately expel individuals exhibiting unsportsmanlike conduct from show grounds and suspend or expel the individual from future CCBA events.
- c. A list of suspended individuals will be emailed to each affiliate association as they are updated.

H. HORSE SHOW RULES

- Regular Day shows will consist of the same core classes. Special events, classes or individual events may be added.
- b. Championship Show does not have any prerequisite requirements for exhibition. Show will have an expanded class list based on the CCBA Day Show schedule along with special event classes and division requirements.
- c. Class Lists will be posted at least 30 days prior to the start of the show.
- d. Partner show
 - i. CCBA may point affiliate open shows with similar class lists.
 - ii. A form will be provided for exhibitors to fill out for points to be allocated appropriately.
- e. Dressage may be held as a special event at a Horse Show or as a standalone event.
 - i. USEF or WDAA rules will be used for conducting and judging dressage.
- f. "Horse" as used in this rule book refers to all equines including horses, ponies, donkeys and mules.
- g. "Open"
 - i. Horse: is open to all breeds and types of horses and longears. They do not have to be registered, or be a Color Breed.
 - ii. Exhibitor: is open to all age and level of rider including professionals and youth
 - iii. Open to riders who may be Walk-Trot or Walk-Trot-Canter.
- h. "Color" is open to any "color" breed such as paint/pinto, appaloosa, palomino, buckskin, dun, gruella, roan. Horses do not have to be registered provided they have color characteristics for the breed they represent. Breeding stock/solid are required to have registration papers.
- i. Adult refers to exhibitors 19 and over as of January 1 of that calendar year, both professional and Amateur alike.
- j. Junior and Youth both refer to exhibitors 18 and under as of January 1 of that calendar vear.
- k. All Age is open to all age and level of rider including professionals and youth. WT riders must show Walk-Trot, and WTC riders must show Walk Trot Canter.
- I. Non-pro refers to an Amateur of any age, and not a trainer or professional who takes money for training horses, or teaching lessons.
- m. Stallions are permitted but must be handled by experienced adult horse person and if unacceptable behavior is exhibited the stallion will be excused from the shows and all show fees forfeited.
- n. In all divisions and classes, each animal must be serviceably sound for horse show purposes. However, in all cases if the unsoundness is sufficiently severe to be considered an act of cruelty or abuse, the judge may ask the rider to leave the class and/or bar the entry from further competition.
- o. Exhibitors are encouraged to show their horse to the best of their ability, this includes neat and clean. Horses may be shown clipped or unclipped according to owner preference or breed standard. Braiding, banding or extensions are not required.
- p. No whip over 6' long including snapper may be used either inside or outside the ring by a horse handler or assistant when showing a horse. Lashes, appendages of any kind or electric devices of any kind are prohibited. Excessive use of a whip or spurs on any horse in a stall, runway, schooling area or show ring, by any person will be considered an act of cruelty and abuse and will result in eviction from showgrounds and forfeiting all fees. Any form of cruelty/neglect will not be tolerated and should be reported to the show manager.
- q. Copies of Rabies Certificate as well as Negative Coggins must be shown to the secretaries booth at all shows or sent in to show management before a horse enters any classes.
- r. Attire And Tack Requirements
 - i. CCBA Rated full dress show.
 - 1. Appropriate full dress clothing for each discipline is required.

- Riders and handlers using equipment and clothing considered schooling may be asked to leave the arena to change and forfeit your entry for that class.
- 3. English Attire
 - Junior riders showing in English saddles must wear an approved helmet.
 - b. Leadline riders must be in an approved ASTM/SEI helmet regardless of seat.
- 4. Western Attire
 - a. Western Chaps are always optional.
 - b. Western Riders may wear either approved ASTM/SEI protective headgear or western hats.
 - c. Leadline riders must be in an approved ASTM/SEI helmet regardless of seat.
 - d. For Ranch Horse requirements, please see <u>Ranch</u> included under <u>Divisions</u> regarding attire and tack requirements.
- ii. CCBA Rated or unrated casual show.
 - 1. Affiliate Associations may hold an all schooling attire show
 - 2. Affiliate Associations may allow safe costumes to be worn for a costume class, or during an entire show.
 - 3. During hot weather you may be allowed to wear short sleeved collared shirts. Tank tops and shirts without collars will be deemed inappropriate. Jackets may also be waived.
- iii. Bits
 - Western horses may be ridden two-handed in a snaffle at any age for any class.
 - 2. Western snaffle and shank bits must be ridden with a chin strap.
 - 3. Bitless bridles such as a Dr. Cook or Bosal are legal for any age horse, and will be shown two-handed like a snaffle.
 - 4. English bits with fixed reins and fixed headstall must be shown with a chin chain.
 - a. Exception: one ring sliding bits.
 - Mechanical Hackamores and sliding bits are only allowed in games class.
 - 6. Judges must eliminate a horse or pony that competes in illegal bits or nosebands. Illegal bits include, but are not limited to, English three ring bits, sliding gags, Sliding bits with more than one ring, or sliding bits with chin chains, bits with noseband pressure built in.
 - a. Exception: Jumping & games classes
 - 7. Illegal nosebands include, but are not limited to, drop, flash and figure eight nosebands.
 - a. Exception: Jumping classes
- iv. For a general use, CCBA will follow the tack rules set by the AQHA rulebook. Please defer to the rulebook most closely aligned with your breed for color characteristics, or additional rules on tack usage and apparel. Every breed has a standard that is correct for them, and you should follow their guidelines to show your horse to the best of their ability.

I. DIVISIONS

a. AQHA

- Any class listed as AQHA will run according to the AQHA rulebook. This includes WT and WTC eligibility
- ii. Whereas CCBA and AQHA rules differ, AQHA rules will apply to AQHA classes
- b. Equestrians with Disabilities (EWD)
 - i. Open to people with physical or cognitive disabilities of any age
 - ii. May ride either in English or Western attire. Saddle and attire must match.
 - iii. May use 2 hands with any bit.
 - iv. Competitors must wear an approved helmet and may show with adaptive equipment as outlined in the AQHA rulebook and listed below.
 - v. All Supported riders must be lead with a halter, lead ropes cannot be attached to the bit.
 - vi. Stallions are not permitted in EWD classes.
 - vii. Permissible Adaptive Equipment listed below. CCBA may approve additional or different adaptive equipment for both supported and unsupported riders.

1. Saddle

- a. Raised pommel
- b. Raised cantle
- c. Hard hand holds
- d. Soft hand holds
- e. Seat saver
- f. Knee rolls/blocks
- g. Thigh rolls/blocks
- h. Padded saddle flaps
- i. Bareback Pads (with & without stirrups)

2. Stirrups

- a. Rubber bands around foot and stirrup
- b. Enclosed stirrups
- c. Strap from stirrup leather to girth/cinch
- d. Strap from stirrup to girth/cinch
- e. No stirrups
- f. One stirrup

- 3. Bridle/Reins
 - a. Looped rein/s
 - b. Connecting bar reins
 - c. Bridging rein
 - d. Ladder reins
 - e. Rein guides (rein through ring on saddle)
 - f. Elastic insert in reins
- 4. Whips
 - a. One or two whips
 - b. Strap attaching whip to hand
- 5. Riding Attire
 - a. No boots if using safety stirrups (Peacock, S-shaped irons or Devonshire stirrups)
 - b. Modified riding boots
 - c. Gaiters
 - d. Half chaps
 - e. Off set spurs
 - f. Safety vest
- 6. Posture, Postural, Supports & Orthoses
 - a. L or R Arm sling
 - b. Neck collar
 - c. Ankle foot orthoses
 - d. Prosthesis
 - e. Wrist brace
 - f. Back support
 - g. Trunk support
 - h. Gait belt
- 7. Other Aids
 - a. Commander using sign language
 - b. Audio Communications (for hearing impaired)
 - c. Voice
- c. Green Horse
 - i. Open to horses of any age in their 1st and 2nd years of showing under saddle. Any horse who is proven not to be truly green may be disqualified. Must be ridden by experienced riders and can cross into any other appropriate classes. Green Horse classes will be judged on the horse.
 - ii. Halter is open to any Junior horse 5 & under <u>or</u> horses of any age in their 1st and 2nd years of showing under saddle.
- d. In hand
 - i. Fitting and showmanship to be judged on the execution of the pattern provided
 - 1. May be shown English or Western unless stated.
 - a. English Showmanship may be shown in a plain leather halter with a lead or bridle
 - b. Rider and horse attire must match.
 - 2. Halter to be judged on the conformation/soundness of the horse
 - 3. May be shown English or Western unless class denotes type
 - Western halter must be shown in western attire for both the horse and exhibitor
 - 5. English Halter must be shown in English attire for both horse and exhibitor
 - a. May be shown in Plain leather halter with lead, or bridle

- 6. Ranch Halter will be judged on suitability as well as confirmation.
 - a. It is suggested the horse be shown in plain Ranch attire. Please see f. Ranch Horse for further rules.
- 7. Color Breed halter classes to be judged on the color characteristics of the horse along with the conformation/soundness of the horse.
- 8. Color Breed halter is also open to registered solid or breeding stock who are registered. Copies of papers must be provided as proof of registration. Papers do not need to be in the name of the exhibitor.
- 9. Palomino classes are also open to perlinos, albinos, cremellos
- 10. Buckskin classes are also open to dun and grullo
- 11. Paint/Pinto and Appaloosa classes are also open to registered solid or breeding stock who are registered.
 - a. Paint/Pinto is not open to horses with Appaloosa showing characteristics regardless of registration status. Horses may not cross enter between Paint/Pinto and /Appaloosa class.
- ii. Model horse is based 50% on confirmation, and 50% on the representation of the breed. The judge may ask for your horse's breed, age or sex.
- iii. Green Horse
 - 1. Halter is open to any Junior horse 5 & under for all years showing.
 - 2. Horses of any age in their 1st and 2nd years of showing under saddle.

e. Jumping

- i. Jumping patterns will be posted at the show, and will not be posted prior.
- ii. All horses entered in jumping classes will be charged one warm up fee of \$5.
- iii. Horses may be ridden by multiple riders. Riders may ride more than one horse.
- iv. All points will be based on horse/rider combination.
- v. Rider/Horse combination may not cross enter between vertical and crossrail divisions.
 - Advanced or professional riders showing green horses may show in cross rails
- vi. Crossrails
 - 1. Open to all riders regardless of age and ability including professionals on Green Horses.
 - 2. May be done at a Trot or Canter. WT riders must trot the jumps
 - 3. Will not be set higher than 18"
 - 4. May contain small flower filler
- vii. Vertical divisions
 - 1. Height divisions
 - a. 2"
 - b. 2'3"
 - c. 2'6"
 - 2. Jumps may contain walls, flower filler, etc.
 - 3. Not open to WT riders.
- viii. Equitation
 - 1. Judged on the rider's ability to jump and control the horse
- ix. Hunters
 - 1. Judged on the Horse's ability to jump clearly and cleanly
- x. Jumpers
 - 1. One round of Power, Clean runs advance to speed and are timed over the set course.
- xi. Derby
 - 1. Derby
 - a. Prerequisite for derby must do at least one vertical class at either the 2" or 2'3" height
 - b. 1 round of at least 6 jumps including an in/out of the ring jump & 1 trot jump

- c. If 10 or more are entered, there will be a 2nd round of top 6 scores.
- d. Jumps to be 2'-2'3" high. Courses will contain 2'6" options.
- e. Numerical scoring, prizes: 1st -6th place

18" Derby

- a. Will not be set higher than 18"
- b. Open to all riders regardless of age and ability including professionals on Green Horses.
- c. May be done at a Trot or Canter. WT riders must trot the jumps
- d. 1 round of at least 6 jumps including an in/out of the ring jump &
 1 walk or trot jump
- e. If 10 or more are entered, there will be a 2nd round of top 6 scores.
- f. Numerical scoring, prizes: 1st -6th place

f. Leadline

- i. Open to all youth 11 & under. All leaders must be an adult over 18.
- All Leadline riders regardless of seat <u>must</u> be wearing an ASTM/SEI approved helmet.
- iii. All Leadline horses must be led with a halter, lead ropes cannot be attached to the bit.

g. Open WT

- i. Open to all riders WT or WTC riders
- ii. Open to English and Western
- iii. No Day End Division Awards

h. Pattern Classes.

- i. All patterns except jumping will be posted prior to the day of the show.
- ii. Horses may be ridden by multiple riders.
- iii. All classes run with patterns will not hold any rail work
- iv. Horsemanship Pattern
 - 1. Is open to Western and English riders of all ages unless specified.
 - 2. Is split WT & WTC
 - 3. Horses may be ridden by multiple riders, points will follow the horse/rider combination.

v. Ranch Horse

1. See Section h.

vi. Ground Poles

- 1. Are open to all seats, and all types.
- 2. May be trotted or cantered
- 3. Will be judged on 50% equitation, and 50% pleasure/horse over the poles based on the judges discretion.
- 4. Horses may be ridden by multiple riders, points will follow the horse/rider combination.

i. Ranch Horse

- i. Is Open to Western riders of all ages
- ii. WT Ranch classes are Open to Horses who are green horse eligible, and may be ridden by a rider of any level. Horses may not cross enter into WT & WTC Ranch by the same rider if being entered as green.
- iii. Riders may ride in both WT and WTC Ranch on separate horses. Points follow Horse/Rider combination
- iv. Ranch Class Apparel and Equipment
 - 1. These classes are only open to horses shown in western tack.
 - 2. Attire and tack should be clean and presentable. Working tack and clothing is encouraged.
 - 3. Horses will <u>not</u> be disqualified for hoof polish, braided or banded manes, or tail extensions.
 - a. Exception: AQHA classes

- 4. Trimming inside ears is discouraged.
- 5. Trimming bridle path, fetlocks or excessively long facial hair is allowed.
- 6. Silver halters, bridles and saddles are discouraged.
- 7. Equipment with silver, or a turned out horse should not count over a good working outfit.

v. Classes.

- 1. Ranch Halter
 - a. Braided or banded manes and tail extensions are discouraged.
 - b. Horses are to be shown in a good working halter: rope, braided, nylon or plain leather. Silver on halter or lead is discouraged.
- 2. Rail/ Pleasure
 - a. Horses will be shown at walk, trot and lope in each direction of the arena. Horses will also be asked to reverse, stop and back.
 - b. The judge must ask for an extended trot and extended lope in at least one direction of the ring. WT class will not be asked to lope.
- Pattern
 - a. WTC Pattern will be chosen from the AQHA rulebook or similar
 - b. WT Pattern will be a modification of the regular Ranch Pattern
- 4. Ranch Round Up
 - a. This is a timed event to prove the agility, versatility and the quickness of a ranch horse
 - b. Exhibitors will perform a specific pattern designed by ECRRA .

 The pattern must be run correctly the fastest time wins.
 - c. Penalties: Knock down of each obstacle will be a 5 second penalty added to the time, Performing the pattern incorrectly will result in a no time and will not place.
 - d. Walk Trot entries, loping more than 3 strides in a pattern will result in a NO TIME and will not place. (Any rules not covered in the ECRRA rule book will refer to AQHA or SHOT rules)

j. Rail classes

- i. Classes shown as a group
 - 1. Rail classes may be split at the discretion of the show management. A & B sections may receive their own class & day end awards. Year end awards will include all riders in the division.
 - a. Any class of 13 & more must be split at GHC
- ii. "Pleasure" is open to Western and English combined if not specifically defined as Western or English, and will be judged on the horse.
 - 1. May ask for the extension of the walk or trot/jog.
- iii. Equitation classes judged on the rider
 - 1. WTC is open to both Professionals and Amateurs.
 - 2. Both seats may be asked for extended trot, & no stirrups, or rising trot.
 - 3. English may be asked for two-point at any gait, or sitting trot.
- Discipline or Command classes judged on the precision, timing, and execution of the commands
 - May be asked for turns, sidepass, circles at any gait. Staying off the rail & working back to the rail. Extension of walk & trot, halt, back, or any combination.

k. Senior Horse

- Any horse considered 18 years of age and older and can cross into any other classes.
- ii. Open to riders of all levels, WT & WTC riders although riding classes are shown at the walk and trot only. Coggins or papers can be used as proof of age.
- iii. Open to both Western or English riders
- iv. Year end points follow the horse/rider combination
 - 1. Exception: Senior Horse Overall Trophy.
- I. Small Equine Division

- i. Eligibility
 - 1. Height
 - a. Small Equine In-Hand classes are open to any equine (horse, pony, donkey or mule) that is less than 48" (12hh) when measured at the highest point of the withers standing square.
 - 2. Open to exhibitors of all ages, and small equines of all types and sexes.
 - a. Open to Minis, Ponies, Donkeys and Mules
 - b. Small equines should be shown in the equipment best suited to their type.
- ii. Halter
 - 1. All types shown together
 - 2. Small equines should be shown in the equipment best suited to their type.
- iii. Showmanship
 - 1. May be shown in English or western attire and equipment unless specified
- iv. Discipline Rail in Hand
 - 1. Judged with the same rules as discipline rail under saddle.
- v. Hunter
 - 1. Judged as Hunter over Fences.
 - 2. Show over the course posted.
- vi. Jumping
 - 1. Judged on time.
 - 2. Shown over the course posted.
- vii. Trail
 - 1. Trail Class
 - May be shown in English or western attire and equipment unless specified
 - Trail classes will be judged on the execution of the trail obstacles.

m. Trail Class

- Horses may be ridden by multiple riders, points will follow the horse/rider combination.
- ii. Trail classes will be judged on the execution of the trail obstacles.
- iii. Green horses may cross enter to other appropriate divisions.

n. Walk Trot

- i. Open to all ages and are open to riders who have NEVER cantered at a show before, or who are going back to showing walk trot only due to age or physical limitations. Doctors or Veterinary notes may be required, and any rider who is proven to show at the walk-trot-canter at another show in the same calendar year may be disqualified and have their year end points forfeited. CCBA show manager reserves the right to make the final call on all riding levels.
 - 1. Exception: Showing dressage with canter in the pattern.
- ii. If a rider has cantered in previous years, the rider may be asked to provide a declaration of Walk-Trot.
- AQHA Walk-Trot eligibility is different from CCBA. You may be eligible to show Walk-Trot in AQHA classes and Walk-Trot-Canter at the same show.
- iv. Exceptions. The follow classes will allow walk-trot-canter riders to enter.
 - 1. Senior Horse
 - 2. Green Horse
 - 3. Open Walk Trot
 - 4. Ranch Horse (shown as green)
- J. Year end awards
 - a. Given to CCBA Members
 - b. Points

- Points will be given out based on placings regardless of the number of riders in each class shown or division.
 - 1. 1st place: 7 points
 - 2. 2nd place: 5 points
 - 3. 3rd place: 4 points
 - 4. 4th place: 3 points
 - 5. 5th place: 2 points
 - 6. 6th place: 1 point
- ii. Exhibitors will have a period of 14 days after points are posted after each show to dispute them or ask for corrections.

c. Class Awards

- i. Classes awarded for top year end winners. Points are accumulated throughout the entire regular show season, and points will follow the rider. .
- ii. Places 1st-10th or 1st-6th

d. Division Awards

- Division awards given away instead of class awards for classes grouped together by division. Divisions:
 - 1. Leadline
 - 2. EWD
 - 3. Green Horse

e. High Point Exhibitor

This is a combination of all classes and all horses that one rider has shown. Awards will be given to the top ten riders. All ages and seats compete together.

f. High Point Halter Horse

 This includes all Halter and in Hand Trail Classes. Points are accumulated throughout the entire regular show season. Awards will be given to the top ten horses. Horses can have multiple handlers. Only points accumulated from members count.

g. High Point Horse

This includes all classes. Points are accumulated throughout the entire regular show season. Awards will be given to the owner of the top ten horses. Horses can have multiple exhibitors. Only points accumulated from members count.

h. High Point Color Breed

i. This award will go to the horse with the highest number of points that also qualified for and competed in at least one Color Breed Class. Horses can have multiple exhibitors. Only points accumulated from members count.

i. Perpetual Trophies

- i. All trophies are never to be retired unless specified.
- ii. The perpetual trophy is awarded each year for the overall class winner to be presented at the year end and returned at the last show of the calendar year.
 - 1. <u>High Point Western Team</u>: *Donated by Heidi Smith* Points based on horses only shown in Western Ranch classes. Points are accumulated

throughout the entire regular show season, points will follow each horse/rider combination showing. Classes that count are: Ranch Halter, Ranch Rail, and Ranch Pattern. Western Trail points will break any ties. Must show in Western Halter at least one show, and must ride at least one show.

2. <u>Senior Horse Trophy:</u> High Point Senior horse. Only Senior Horse classes to count. Points are accumulated throughout the entire regular show season, points will follow the horse regardless of rider. Never to be retired.

j. Affiliate Programs

- i. Trail Miles
 - Trail Miles run November 1st October 31st. All miles must be in by November 15th. These are miles earned outside of the arena or show pen. This runs on an honor system, please use a tracker to track your trail miles ridden. Please submit miles on a weekly or monthly basis to CCBA.
 - 2. Riders will be awarded based on the amount of most miles ridden 1st-10th places.
- ii. Dressage Scores
 - 1. We will award Traditional and Western dressage separately.
 - 2. Scores will be calculated from November 1st October 31st. All placings must be submitted by November 15th.
 - a. Points will be given out based on score. See chart below.
