

AP Policy Waiver Request

Carondelet values a healthy balance of rigorous academics and meaningful extracurricular activities. The objective of our program is to provide opportunities for progressive growth. Our AP Policy enables eligible students to take a maximum of two AP's during sophomore year, three AP's junior year, and four AP's senior year.

We recognize there may be instances in which a few students have a strong desire and

ability to exceed this AP policy. Students who seek a waiver to exceed the above recommended number of AP courses must do the following to obtain approval.

_____1. The student must have met with each AP teacher to inquire about the workload and time commitment anticipated for each class the student wishes to take.

_____2. The **student** must provide a detailed rationale explaining their genuine wish to take the classes they indicate. This rationale should include an understanding of the program and course workload.

_____3. That student has successful previous experience in advanced coursework. For example: a rising sophomore student has opted into Honors level mastery coursework options. A rising junior has taken an AP and honors courses as a sophomore.

_____4. The student meets all prerequisites for each class, without the need of a waiver.

_____5. The student must be recommended for each of the AP courses by their existing teacher.

____7. The student met with their College Counselor to discuss this. The Counselor will review the student's past academic performance, extracurricular activities, and have a conversation if the courses the student wishes to take are beneficial to their prospective future academic course of study and college plans.

____8. If the AP Policy waiver is approved, the student agrees to have a check-in meeting with her Counselor at the end of the first two weeks of school.
