# Health and parenting needs

Through a grant from COSAF, the Transfer and Reentry Center (TRC) is able to offer student parents a 3-month membership and \$100 gift card to pay for babysitting services.

### **Funding**

- Graduate Child Care Grants help defray the costs of childcare expenses
- <u>Alternative Budget Form</u>: Citizen and Permanent Resident students with minor children and with a FAFSA on file can submit an Alternate Budget Request Form, to increase their financial aid need and be repackaged for more aid.

#### Academic

- The Transfer and Reentry Center provides <u>outreach emails to faculty</u> to assist students with communication and support with their faculty:
- Support for pregnant students through the Student Disability Center
   Pregnant students may wish to seek academic accommodation services and support through the Student Disability Center.
- <u>Part-time status application</u>: Students may petition for approval of for a minimum of one and a maximum of three consecutive regular terms (Fall, Winter, Spring). Successive petitions are permitted. Please be aware that some fellowships and graduate

employment require full-time status as a student for eligibility, please check if part-time status might jeopardize your funding. If you are a student parent or medical caregiver for another family member and need to submit a <u>Part Time Status Application to the Office of the University Registrar</u>, please email Marissa at mlweiss@ucdavis.edu to request a letter of support for your application.

- Planned Educational Leave Program: The Planned Educational Leave Program (PELP)
  allows any continuing graduate student to temporarily suspend academic work at UC
  Davis. Graduate students may take may take PELP leave of up to three consecutive
  quarters. Please be aware that many student benefits (SHIP, campus housing, student
  employment) are tied to active student status, and PELPing students are not eligible for
  campus resources during their leave.
  - New graduate students are not eligible for PELP during their first term of instruction and should contact their Graduate Program Advisor prior to the first day of instruction. Continuing graduate students apply for PELP through their Graduate Program.
