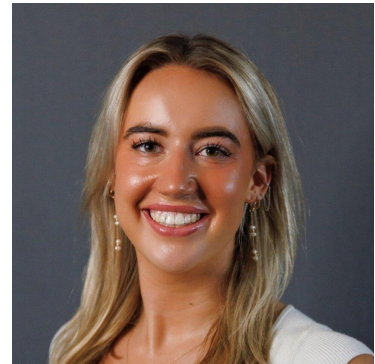
Lila Burns
