BOOKING MEMO FOR DORIAN WARREN Leading Progressive Economic Scholar, Grassroots Organizer and Media Personality Available to Speak on 2024 Election, Economy

(WASHINGTON)—Dorian Warren is a unique force in progressive politics in America who has a deep and intuitive understanding of the wavering state of our multi-racial democracy and economic well being, with a close ear to the ground of social movements and voter sentiments.

Warren, the Co-President of Community Change Action, is available to comment on issues including: the 2024 election, low-income voters and voters of color, democracy and voting rights, child care and the care economy, health equity, guaranteed income, racial justice, and more. Warren is a former MSNBC contributor and was host and executive producer of "Nerding Out" on MSNBC's digital platform.

As a commentator on public affairs, Warren has appeared regularly on television and radio including NBC Nightly News, ABC, MSNBC, CNN, CNBC, BET, BBC, NPR, Bloomberg, & NY1, among other outlets. He has also written for *The Nation*, *Huffington Post*, *Newsweek*, *Salon*, *The Washington Post*, *The New York Times*, *Medium*, *Ebony.com*, and *Boston Review*.

Warren can speak about the future of the American electorate and how progressive grassroots groups are upending politics from the ground up by engaging more people of color, women, young people and other infrequent voters. He can talk about MAGA extremism and Donald Trump's threat to our democracy, basic rights and freedoms, and economic and racial justice.

Warren is also co-founder of the Economic Security Project and taught for over a decade at the University of Chicago and Columbia University, where he was co-director of the Columbia University Program on Labor Law and Policy. He's the co-author of <u>The Hidden Rules of Race</u>, co-editor of <u>Race and American Political Development</u>, and has penned numerous <u>academic</u> <u>articles</u>. He was previously a Fellow at the <u>Roosevelt Institute</u> and serves on the boards of the Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights Education Fund, the National Employment Law Project, and *The Nation* Magazine Editorial Board, among others.
