### **THE STRUGGLE IS REAL!! (and also kind of necessary...)**

Hello from your WAMS Counselors! We've been keeping busy recently, meeting with many learners to help them with their academic and personal/social needs. We're invested in their success and happiness, just like you. and just like you, it's hard for us to see kids struggle - our instinct as counselors is to rescue them from it. We're sure you can relate! But sometimes, rescuing them isn't what's best. Some of the best learning experiences and personal growth comes through difficulties. There is a story we'd like to share that illustrates this idea perfectly.

#### **The Little Boy and The Butterfly**

*A young boy and his mother went for a walk one afternoon, and came across a butterfly cocoon. Excited to teach her son about the metamorphosis from chrysalis to beautiful monarch, they gently collected it and brought it home. They watched, over the course of days, as the butterfly began to emerge from its confinement. It managed to create a small hole in the cocoon, but its body was too large to emerge. It grew tired and became still.*

*Wanting to help the butterfly, the mother and son carefully snipped a slit in the cocoon with a pair of scissors. But the butterfly was small, weak, and its wings crumpled. They expected the insect to take flight, but instead it could only drag its undeveloped body along the ground. It was incapable of flying. In their eagerness to help the butterfly, they stunted its development. What they did not know was that the butterfly needed to go through the process of struggling against the cocoon to gain strength and fill its wings with blood. It was the struggle that made it stronger.*



It goes against the nature of any parent to watch their child struggle. And there are certainly times that your assistance is necessary. But middle school is a period of so much growth, and we all want our learners to have the opportunity to learn about themselves and about how the world works. Learning to advocate for themselves now will prepare them to be independent and confident adults in the years ahead. As the expression goes, "Do not prepare the road for your child; instead, prepare your child for the road." Equip kids with the tools they need to succeed, then step back and allow them to use them. It's certainly not the easiest thing to do, but all kids deserve to have the opportunity to thrive as independent adults.

## Fees & Obligations

On the Sapphire portal there is an area for fees. Click on the link to see if your learner owes anything to the school. If they have an outstanding fee you can find the missing textbook, calculator, sports uniform, etc and return it. If you are unable to find the missing item you can pay for it at the WAMS Office. We accept cash or checks made out to WASD.

Have you moved? Please update the WAMS office with your address and provide proof of residency.

Do you check the Sapphire portal? Announcements are updated on the portal, report cards are posted on the portal. If you do not have a WASD Sapphire portal go to this link. [Here](#) If you have forgotten your username or password contact the office.

## IMPORTANT FOR ALL PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

Photo Id's are required to pick up a learner. Even if you send a note you must present your photo id at the office.

Parents ~ if your child is tardy they are permitted to come into the building without a parent. However if you are picking up your student you must come in the building to sign your child out. You must have a photo id to pick up your child.

If you need a grandparent, relative or friend to pick up your child please specify on the note who will be picking up your child. **A photo ID must be shown in order to pick up any learner at WAMS.**

When a student is absent or leaving early for an appointment parents should send in a note. Those notes are turned into the office first thing in the morning.

If you forget to send a note no need to worry ~ just call the WAMS Office and let us know. We will have you write a note when you pick up your learner.

# Related Arts Spotlight

What is the biggest question that parents ask at parent-teacher conferences? “**How can I know my learner's work and if they have it turned in?**” One of the best ways is for parents to have a Schoolology account where they can see what is going on with their classes. To get this you simply need to email the team leader for your learner and ask for the Schoolology Parent Access code. If you have multiple learners at WAMS they will each have a different code. However, you will only need one account. This will allow you to see their assignments in Schoolology and if they have submitted their work for that assignment.

After you get the code you will go [HERE](#) and create a parent account if you don't already have one. If you are a district employee DO NOT use your district email address. Then you will enter in your codes to add access to your learners. Once you have registered for parent access you will have it from year to year. You will not have to re-register each year.

### ***Dress Code! Updated!!!***

The Waynesboro Area School District has a dress code that is enforced everyday! If you have not had a chance to read the district Dress Code please do so [HERE!](#)

Students who are sent to the office for dress code will have the opportunity to change if they have alternative clothes, may choose from extra clothing items we have available in the nurse's office (all laundered after each use), or may call home for additional clothing items to be brought into school.

### ***Bullying...***

Bullying is **NOT tolerated** in the Middle School or in the District! If you suspect bullying in any way please alert school staff **immediately!** It is extremely important that students report bullying and other inappropriate interactions as quickly as possible. **We as school staff and officials will be unable to help or address the issue if we don't know it's happening!**

If cyber-bullying or bullying in general is occurring off of school grounds or after school hours my recommendation is to call the Boro Police, Washington Township Police, or PA State Police depending on where you live or where the incident happened. ***After calling the police please let school staff know about the incident so we can take proactive measures here in the building.*** In case of cyber-bullying, I also recommend taking screenshots, pictures, or videos of the incident on social media to give to the police.

## **IMPORTANT Safety Info for Families**

Several WASD Board policies reference the use of prescription medications and use/possession of drugs or alcohol on school property.

- **POLICY 210 - Medications**

*All prescription and over-the-counter medications MUST be kept in the school nurse's office at all times unless medical documentation is on file for the learner to self carry. Common examples include inhalers and epipens. Please contact our school nurse, Mrs. Torey Kauffman ([Torey\\_Kauffman@wasdpa.org](mailto:Torey_Kauffman@wasdpa.org)) with any questions.*

- **POLICY 222 - Tobacco and Vaping Products**

*All tobacco products and vaping products are prohibited on school property and on school-sponsored events. Learners found to be in possession of tobacco and/or vaping products are subject to disciplinary consequences and referral for prosecution.*

- **POLICY 227 - Controlled Substances/Paraphernalia**

*Controlled substances, look-alike drugs, and paraphernalia are prohibited on school property and on school-sponsored events. "Violations of this policy may result in disciplinary action up to and including expulsion and referral for prosecution."*

*Please review these policies and talk to your child about the **importance of keeping these illegal substances out of our schools.***

# Attendance Matters!!

**Regular attendance is an important part of your student's success at WAMS!  
Please review the following policies and go over them with your child.**

On the day a student returns to school, parents should send a written note stating the date and reason for the absence. When no excuse is received within three days of return, the absence is considered unlawful. In addition, a doctor/professional note is required if a student is out 3 or more consecutive school days. Notes are always needed for students leaving school early for appointments. Even if your student is 18 or older, notes are required to leave school before dismissal. If you need to pick your student up early for an appointment, please provide a note in advance. Doing so helps school staff get your student out of class on time for their dismissal. Please send negative COVID results with your child if they have been out for COVID testing. If an absence note is not received within three days and the student accumulates 6 or more unexcused absences, the student will then be referred to the county truancy court office. Truancy, the illegal or unexcused absence from school, violates the attendance policies of the Waynesboro Area School District and state law. If convicted of truancy, a parent, guardian, or person acting as the parent of a child can be subject to any or all of the following sentences:

- Payment of a fine not exceeding \$300, plus court costs (first offense)
- Required community service for a period of up to six (6) months
- Completion of a mandatory parenting education program
  - Failure to pay truancy fines, complete assigned community service, and/or parenting education programs can result in a jail sentence for the parent or guardian for a period not to exceed five (5) days. Under the law, school district attendance officers and state and municipal police officers are given full police power and may arrest or apprehend any child who fails to attend school in compliance with the provisions of Act 29.

Please check your student's Sapphire Community Portal periodically. It is important to make sure your student has turned in their notes and their attendance record is accurate. Your child may become ineligible for school dances, parking passes, or other school-based activities if they have excessive unexcused absences. Again, thank you for your patience and understanding during this school year and for reinforcing policies and procedure

### Vehicle Operation on School Property

#### RULES OF THE ROAD

The roadways and parking lots that are upon the Waynesboro Area School District properties are governed by PA Vehicle Code Title 75 and therefore all laws and rules of the road apply. Speed Limits are clearly posted (15 MPH), Stop Signs and Do Not Enter Signs are also posted at various locations to ensure the utmost safety of our students, faculty, staff and visitors. Violators of PA traffic laws may be cited upon a State Traffic Citation which could result in fines and points assessed to their driving records.

## PARKING

Parking on Waynesboro Area School District properties is a privilege and not a right. Visitor parking stalls are for visitors. Violations of parking regulations can result in a parking ticket being issued, fines levied and for repeated violations towed away at owners' expense.

## WASD Student User Accounts

As a reminder to our families, WASD implemented password complexity and history requirements in Spring, 2022. These requirements are enforced on all our district provided accounts including student accounts. ***This means that students are no longer able to use a simple password such as their lunch number.***

The district password policy requirements are as follows:

- Users will be ask to change their password every 60 days
- Users won't be able to use their previous 10 passwords
- Passwords must be at least 6 Characters
- Passwords can't contain any part of the users name
- Passwords must contain at least three of the following:
- Uppercase Letter
- Lowercase Letter
- Number
- Symbol
