Tour program:

Day 1: WELCOME TO ISRAEL

Arrival at Ben Gurion Airport (Tel Aviv) by flight ____, arrival at _____. The tour guide meets the group at the airport. If it's not late yet, we will walk through the ancient streets of Jaffa – the "Bride of the Sea," an old seaport located on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea. Transfer to Jerusalem, check-in at the hotel. Overnight stay at the Jerusalem hotel.

Day 2: Pilgrimage Tour: Discovering the Holy City of Jerusalem

Breakfast. Jerusalem is often referred to as the City of God, and this tour will help you understand why this ancient city truly deserves such a name.

Mount of Olives

From this sacred mountain, we will take in a breathtaking panoramic view of olive groves, rolling hills, and the majestic city of Jerusalem. The area is home to numerous significant landmarks, with three key sites located on different peaks.

Gethsemane Garden

In this magnificent and serene garden, where Jesus preached to His disciples and spent His final night, we will visit the Church of All Nations, also known as the Church of the Agony. Here, we will see ancient olive trees that are over 2,000 years old, standing as silent witnesses to history.

Via Dolorosa – The Way of Sorrow

Walking along the famous street of the Old City, which begins at St. Stephen's Gate and ends at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, we will follow the path Jesus took on His way to crucifixion. Pilgrims visit four of the fourteen Stations of the Cross, each marking a moment from His final journey.

Church of the Holy Sepulchre

This extraordinary complex is home to some of the most significant Christian sites and represents a unique multicultural and interfaith heritage. Within its walls, we will visit the Chapel of the Holy Sepulchre, Golgotha (Calvary), the Church of the Resurrection, and various monasteries and shrines belonging to different religious communities.

The Western Wall

The most sacred site for Jews, the Western Wall (Kotel) dates back to the time of the Second Temple. Historical records referencing the Wall go as far back as the 4th century. It remains a place of prayer and remembrance for the destruction of the Second Temple by the Roman Empire.

This journey through Jerusalem will not only deepen your spiritual connection but also offer a profound insight into the city's rich history, diverse cultures, and timeless devotion. Return to the Jerusalem hotel.

Day 3: The Holy Sites of Bethlehem: The Milk Grotto and Shepherds' Field

Breakfast. You are invited on a unique spiritual journey to Bethlehem, the second most significant Christian site after Jerusalem. This sacred city, one of the oldest inhabited places in the world, is located in the Palestinian Territories and is home to one of the world's most ancient Christian communities. Its name, Beit Lehem, means "House of Bread".

Church of the Nativity – A Gateway to Christian History

Pilgrims from across the globe come to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, whose doors have remained open since the 6th century. The church's most revered site is the Grotto of the Nativity, marking the birthplace of Jesus Christ, venerated even by Protestants. Another cherished relic inside the church is the Icon of the Smiling Virgin Mary, a rare depiction of the Mother of God.

Milk Grotto – A Sanctuary for Families

Not far from the Church of the Nativity lies the Milk Grotto, where, according to tradition, the Holy Family sought refuge from King Herod. For centuries, this site has been a place of pilgrimage for women praying for fertility and blessings for their children.

Shepherds' Field – The First Announcement of Christ's Birth

Continuing our journey, we will visit the border of Bethlehem and the village of Beit Sahour (translated from Arabic as the "House of Shepherds"). According to the Gospel, it was here that angels appeared to the shepherds, proclaiming the birth of the Savior.

Church of St. Nicholas – The Legacy of a Beloved Saint

Our final stop is the Church of St. Nicholas the Wonderworker, located in the small Arab town of Beit Jala. Here, you will have the opportunity to see the tiny cave where St. Nicholas is believed to have lived for several years in the 4th century.

This pilgrimage to Bethlehem offers a deep connection to the origins of Christianity, allowing you to walk in the footsteps of faith and experience the profound spiritual heritage of these sacred sites. Return to the Jerusalem hotel.

Day 4: The Holy Sites of Jerusalem and Ein Karem

Breakfast. Jerusalem is often referred to as the City of God, and this pilgrimage will help you understand why this ancient city has earned such a sacred title.

Ein Karem – The Village of the Visitation

Nestled in the lush hills of Jerusalem, Ein Karem is a place of profound biblical history.

- The Gorny Monastery, also known as the Moscow Mission, is believed to be the site where the Virgin Mary brought the joyful news of Christ's coming birth to Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist. The monastery's Kazan Church houses the revered Kazan Icon of the Mother of God. Nearby, a sacred stone is said to be the very place where John the Baptist preached to his followers.
- The Church of the Visitation, a Franciscan church, commemorates the moment when Mary visited Elizabeth, as described in the Gospel of Luke. Tradition holds that this is where Mary proclaimed her famous hymn of praise, the Magnificat.

This journey through Jerusalem and Ein Karem will take you to the very foundations of faith, where history, devotion, and divine presence come to life.

Time for independent pilgrimage at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, followed by return to the Jerusalem hotel.

Day 5: Journey Through the Judean Desert: Ein Gedi and the Dead Sea

Breakfast. Check out. Our journey takes us through the breathtaking landscapes of the Judean Desert. Along the way, you'll learn about the remarkable discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls, ancient manuscripts that have profoundly influenced our understanding of Judaism.

Our next stop is the Ein Gedi Nature Reserve, a true oasis in the heart of the desert. Here, you'll witness the stunning David's Stream and Waterfall, explore the ruins of an ancient synagogue, and discover a natural mineral spring. Comfortable walking shoes are highly recommended for this part of the tour.

Afterwards, we will head to Ein Bokek Beach, a well-maintained public beach on the shores of the Dead Sea. The area is fully equipped with showers and changing facilities, allowing you to relax and experience the unique sensation of floating effortlessly in the mineral-rich waters.

To conclude our tour, we will visit a Dead Sea cosmetics shop, where you will have the opportunity to purchase high-quality skincare products made from the renowned minerals of this extraordinary region.

Day 6: Sacred and Historic Sites: Latrun, Abu Ghosh, Jaffa & Tel Aviv

Breakfast.. Our journey begins in Latrun, home to the famous Monastery of the Silent Monks, known not only for its serene atmosphere but also for its winery, where monks produce exceptional local wines.

Next, we visit Abu Ghosh, a picturesque village along the highway to Jerusalem. This predominantly Muslim Arab town holds great biblical significance. Scholars believe that on the hill in the western part of the village once stood Kiryat Yearim, the site where the Ark of the Covenant was kept for many years after being returned by the Philistines.

Here, we will visit the Benedictine Monastery. This monastery is home to one of the most beautiful churches in the region. A Latin inscription on an ancient stone embedded in its walls marks the presence of the 10th Roman Legion Fretensis in this area. Inside, the grand prayer hall is adorned with massive square columns and well-preserved medieval frescoes. Today, the monastery remains active, with monks and nuns of the Order of St. Lazarus residing within its walls.

Our next destination is Jaffa, one of the world's oldest port cities, situated on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea. Here, we will admire the legendary Andromeda's Rock, cross the Wishing Bridge, and see the fascinating floating tree, along with many other wonders. Jaffa is a haven for artists, making it a truly unique and vibrant place.

The tour then continues with a panoramic drive through Tel Aviv, where we will pass by Rothschild Boulevard and the historic Ahuzat Bayit neighborhood, the first district of Tel Aviv.

We will extend our visit with an additional walking tour of Jaffa and Tel Aviv. Return to the Jerusalem hotel.

Day 7: Galilee Christian - Jordan River, Nazareth

Breakfast. Journey Through Ancient Galilee: Following in the Footsteps of Christ

There is a saying that Israel is a bridge connecting the past, present, and future. This land, with its millennia-old history, has preserved the immortal legacy of its heritage, carrying it through the ages to the present day. Visiting this sacred corner of the world allows us to touch the mysteries of the Holy Scriptures and experience the unique spiritual energy of these places.

We invite you on an unforgettable pilgrimage through ancient Galilee, retracing the steps of Jesus Christ—from His childhood and youth to the sacred waters of the Jordan River. Our journey will also take us to the Valley of Armageddon, the prophesied site of the final battle between Good and Evil.

Nazareth – The Childhood Home of Jesus

Our first stop is Nazareth, the third holiest city for Christians after Jerusalem and Bethlehem. This is where Jesus spent His early years, growing up in a small agricultural village that housed just a handful of families, including the Holy Family.

The Church of the Annunciation stands as one of the most significant Christian sites in Nazareth. According to tradition, it is built over the Grotto of the Annunciation, where the Angel Gabriel appeared to the Virgin Mary. The present-day Basilica of the Annunciation, completed in 1969, is the largest Catholic church in the Middle East. Its lower level houses the sacred grotto, where visitors can see well-preserved frescoes and artworks from across the world, donated as expressions of faith and devotion.

The Valley of Armageddon – A Place of Prophecy

Despite its ominous name, Armageddon is not the end of the world—at least not yet. According to Christian tradition, the final battle between Good and Evil is foretold to take place at the foot of Tel Megiddo, a site of great historical and strategic significance. In ancient times, Megiddo was a powerful trade and military stronghold, serving as the dominant city-state in Lower Galilee.

The Sacred Jordan River – A Waters of Baptism

The Jordan River, the holiest waters in Christianity, is where Jesus Christ was baptized by John the Baptist. Flowing for 232 km, the Jordan originates at the foot of Mount Hermon, passes through the Sea of Galilee, and empties into the Dead Sea. Once surrounded by tropical forests and home to hippopotamuses, the Jordan River is now a natural border between Israel and Jordan.

Pilgrims from all over the world come to immerse themselves in its sacred waters, following the example of Christ. On the Israeli side, this spiritual experience can be undertaken at the Yardenit Baptismal Site, a beautifully maintained area along the river.

The Sea of Galilee – Israel's Freshwater Treasure

The Sea of Galilee, also known as Lake Kinneret, is Israel's primary freshwater source and the country's natural reservoir. Locals often joke that Israel is surrounded by four seas, with the Kinneret being one of them.

Interestingly, the Sea of Galilee is the lowest freshwater lake in the world—situated 213 meters below sea level. Its breathtaking scenery, where the blue waters meet the rolling beige hills of the Golan Heights, makes it a haven for those seeking peace and natural beauty.

The Greek Orthodox Church of the Twelve Apostles – A Testament to Faith

Located on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, this stunning Greek Orthodox monastery was built in the 1980s on what was once part of biblical Capernaum. Known for its red-domed roof, the church stands as a beacon of Orthodox Christian tradition and a reminder of the enduring spiritual legacy of Galilee. Return to the Jerusalem hotel.

Day 8: Departure day

Breakfast. If there is enough time for a half-day excursion, it can be added for an extra charge. Departure to the airport before the flight.
