News from the Middle School Counselor



Hello Middle School Parents!

I hope you had a nice weekend! This week, I would like to address some concerns about internet safety that have been brought to my attention. A teacher heard some students talking about a website called omegle.com. This website's tagline is "Talk to strangers!" This was very troubling for me to hear, and is precisely the opposite message we want to be giving to young students. So with that, I wanted to not only notify you all of the existence of this website, which your children should definitely not be using, but also provide some tips on how to monitor your child's internet use to make sure they are using it appropriately and safely.

- 1) Talk to your child to set clear guidelines for internet use. This is a chance to set rules for how to use the internet, and a chance to discuss how some websites can be dangerous, especially for kids.
- 2) Establish an internet agreement with your child. Discuss which websites or apps are off-limits.
- 3) Monitor your child's internet use as best you can. I understand this is not an easy task since kids often have their own computers and phones. But there are steps you can take to limit access to certain websites, and ways you can see which websites and apps your child is using on a regular basis. Below, I will provide a link that can help you understand how to set up website restrictions on certain phones and computers.
- 4) If your child is using any social media sites like Facebook, Instagram, etc., you can check their privacy settings and postings to make sure they don't contain personal contact information or inappropriate content.
- 5) Make sure your child understands that under no circumstances should they be providing personal information to anyone over the internet or agree to meet anyone in person.
- 6) Make sure your child knows that they should come to you if anyone says or does something that makes them uncomfortable.
- 7) Adjust the searching options on their devices to make them 'safe'. You can block certain keywords or certain websites altogether.

8) Have a conversation with your child about the use of webcams, chat rooms, and instant messaging. While these can all be great tools for kids, they should understand the potential for harm with all of them and should be made aware of how to recognize potential issues.

News From the Middle School Learning Technology Coordinator

Hi Middle School Parents,

In February we were back in school and happy to have face to face classes. Some grade levels continued their units of study in Technology which began the previous month while others wrapped up units and had their summative assessments.

Grade 5 & 6 Technology

Grades 5 completed their google sheets unit with a fun activity "How would you spend your million dollars?" where they examined how graphs change when data in Google Sheets is altered, use of SUM() functions, how graphs are made and components of a graph. They also compared the advantages of spreadsheets over pen and paper methods.

Grade 6 completed their Graphic design unit by vectorizing their self portrait. For this assignment, students chose a self image of themselves which they liked, then started using tools in google drawing such as polylines, curved line, colors to make a vector image. After completing the assignment students reflected on the process.







Grade 7 & 8 Coding



Grade 7 Quarter 3 group continued with their Coffee Script coding and we concentrated on deepening their understanding of coding. Later, they focused on coding drones and completing some drone challenges.

Grade 8 Coding class continued to get familiar with HTML coding and CSS selectors working on exploring web pages with

Computer Science Discoveries from code.org.



Grade 7 Robotics

The Robotics class was very glad to get back to school and start working with their EV3 robots. The students also had their presentation about self driving cars and designed their very own self driving car and presented it to the class. Students also modified their robots to go up a ramp, which was quite an accomplishment.







In mid February, the robotics class was invited to the board meeting to demonstrate their skills and distribute gifts for Chinese New Year.
























































































































Grade 8 Art Candy Still Life fro FB

Middle School Math Pathways

For math in middle school, we offer Pre-Algebra in Grade 7. In order to move to Algebra 1 in Grade 8 students must score 80% or higher in both Semesters. Alternatively, students can be placed in Algebra 1 in Grade 8 if they score 70-79% for a class average and pass a cumulative exam with a mark of 80% or above. Any Grade 7 student who does not meet these conditions must take Pre-Algebra Part 2 in Grade 8. For Grade 6, any student who does not have 80% or above for a yearly average will take Pre-Algebra Part 1 in Grade 7 and Pre-Algebra Part 2 in Grade 8.

Hair Color Requirement at the TCIS

It is a requirement that students at the TCIS maintain their natural hair color. Other colors (including highlights, shading, etc.) are not acceptable. While students enjoy trying new things in Middle School, hair color is not one of those things that we allow students to experiment with.

Section 5.4-2 (page 29) of the Student Parent Handbook (Uniform and Appearance) regarding hair color:

Hairstyles, if considered inappropriate for students in a school setting, will not be allowed. Hair, even if colored, should be of natural hair color or hue.

ข้อ ๑ ระเบียบนี้เรียกว่า "ระเบียบกระทรวงศึกษาธิการ ว่าด้วยการไว้ทรงผมของนักเรียน พ.ศ. ๒๕๖๓"

ข้อ 🖢 ระเบียบนี้ให้ใช้บังคับตั้งแต่วันถัดจากวันประกาศในราชกิจจานุเบกษาเป็นต้นไป

ข้อ ๓ ในระเบียบนี้

"นักเรียน" หมายความว่า บุคคลซึ่งกำลังศึกษาอยู่ในสถานศึกษา

"สถานศึกษา" หมายความว่า สถานศึกษาในสังกัดหรือกำกับดูแลของกระทรวงศึกษาธิการ ที่จัดการศึกษาขั้นพื้นฐาน เว้นแต่การศึกษานอกระบบและการศึกษาตามอัธยาศัย

"หัวหน้าสถานศึกษา" หมายความว่า ผู้อำนวยการ หรือหัวหน้าสถานศึกษาที่เรียกชื่ออย่างอื่น ที่มีอำนาจหน้าที่หรือวัตถุประสงค์ในการจัดการศึกษา

- ข้อ ๔ นักเรียนต้องปฏิบัติตนเกี่ยวกับการไว้ทรงผม ดังนี้

- (๒) นักเรียนหญิงจะไว้ผมสั้นหรือผมยาวก็ได้ กรณีไว้ผมยาวให้เป็นไปตามความเหมาะสม และรวบให้เรียบร้อย
 - ข้อ ๕ นักเรียนต้องห้ามปฏิบัติตน ตังนี้
 - (๑) ตัดผม
 - (๒) ย้อมสีผมให้ผิดไปจากเติม
 - (m) ไว้หนวดหรือเครา
- (๔) การกระทำอื่นใดซึ่งไม่เหมาะสมกับสภาพการเป็นนักเรียน เช่น การตัดแต่งทรงผม เป็นรูปทรงสัญลักษณ์หรือเป็นลวดลาย
- ข้อ ๖ ความในข้อ ๔ และข้อ ๕ มิให้นำมาใช้บังคับแก่นักเรียนที่มีเหตุผลความจำเป็น ในการปฏิบัติตามหลักศาสนาของตนหรือการดำเนินกิจกรรมของสถานศึกษา

To maintain student and teacher safety, campus is closed to food deliveries (for everyone). Plan to bring everything with you in the morning.

Parents/visitors who wish to enter campus are asked to schedule an appointment through the registrar.

- Masks must be worn at all times, including the classroom.
- Students' temperature is checked upon entrance.
- Late students must check in <u>with the Registrar</u> to receive an "Admit to Class" slip. The registrar is located in the main lobby of the middle school.
- Students must use hand-sanitizer before entering school and before entering each classroom.
- Students must sanitize any shared classroom materials/supplies after each use.
- Students sanitize their desks before leaving from every class, with the provided supplies.
- Students must remain socially distant at all times.
- No more than 4 students in the restroom at any given time.
- Students may take their backpacks into their classroom for each block to avoid groups at the lockers.
- MS Students have a 20 minute transition period between classes.
- Students may wear a face shield as well as a mask but not instead of a mask.
- Lunch (Students' temperature is checked upon entrance to the canteen before lunch.



Students in grades 5-8 use the Accelerated Reader program to track their reading comprehension skills and obtain points based on the books they read each quarter. Accelerated Reader is a software tool that allows students to select their own book and then assess whether a student has completed reading the book by asking a

series of questions. We keep track of this each quarter and have a big party at the end of the year. Accelerated Reader is administered by the English Department under the direction of Mr. Ted, our Curriculum Coordinator and Head of English. Students in each grade are required to read independent novels and get points each quarter.

Student Computers

The Faculty and Administration believe technology is a powerful and integral part of the TCIS instructional program. While there are many good computers on the market, please understand that the TCIS High School requires MacBooks for all students.

1) **TCIS High School** is a MacBook one-to-one school - MacBooks are required for all grade 9 through 12 students



2) TCIS Middle School

- a) MacBooks are recommended for grades 7 & 8 students.
 - i) A Chromebook is acceptable (remember a MacBook is required for grades 9-12)
- b) School owned Chromebooks are provided for grades 5 & 6 students.
- c) All students in Grades 5-8 need access to a computer at their home. Students will be using Google Classroom and various websites for school work. We do recommend a laptop but any computer for home use is fine. iPads and tables are acceptable but have some limitations. Windows-based computers are fine for home use as well but are not allowed on the school network.



Important things to consider when reading content online



TIMELINESS

When was the information published or updated? Does your topic require current information?





RELEVANCE

Does the information answer your main question? Does the information meet the stated requirements for the assignment?



AUTHORITY

Is the author's purpose to sell, persuade, entertain, or inform? Is there an obvious bias? Are other points of view expressed?
