FOR STUDENTS & FAMILIES

Build your career *while you're still in high school.*

The AGO is a district-recognized competitive program at Beaver High School and Milford High School. Qualifying students complete all 24 graduation requirements by the start of 11th grade — then spend junior and senior year in paid internships, apprenticeships, and industry credential programs with real Beaver County employers.

WHAT YOU GRADUATE WITH

- ✓ A standard BCSD diploma plus the Accelerated Graduate Distinction Seal
- ✓ 400–800+ documented work-based learning hours with at least one employer reference letter
- ✓ At least one industry-recognized credential — CNA, OSHA 10, EMT-Basic, CompTIA A+, AWS Welding, Adobe Certified Professional, and more
- ✓ Concurrent college credits through Snow College, SUU, or USU Extension — at little or no cost to your family
- ✓ Full career participation within 1–3 years of graduation — journeyman trade, clinical healthcare career, IT employment, or advanced college standing

HOW TO QUALIFY — START THE PROCESS IN 7TH GRADE

- 1 3.0 GPA or higher maintained from application through graduation
- 2 Algebra I in 8th grade; Calculus (AP or concurrent enrollment) completed by end of 10th grade
- 3 Career Path Plan developed with your parent and counselor beginning in 7th grade, updated annually
- 4 All 24 graduation credits on track for completion by the start of your junior year

FOR BUSINESS & INDUSTRY PARTNERS

Your next employee is in our *classroom right now.*

BCSD employer partners gain access to pre-screened, academically committed students who have already chosen your industry and built a Career Path Plan with their counselor. This is not a volunteer program — it is a structured, district-managed workforce development partnership with documented agreements, compliance support, and real accountability on both sides.

WHAT EMPLOYER PARTNERS RECEIVE

- ✓ **Annual spring openings announcement** — your organization publicly commits to named internship or apprenticeship slots that qualifying students formally compete for
- ✓ **District-managed compliance** — BCSD handles WBL training agreements, OSHA documentation, minor work permits, and legal review at no cost to the employer
- ✓ **Curriculum co-design** — shape CTE course content, guest instruction, and credential focus through the BCSD Industry Advisory Council (meets twice annually)
- ✓ **Registered apprenticeship pathway** — Utah Department of Workforce Services coordination available for employers ready to formalize journeyman pipelines
- ✓ **Public recognition** — named as a BCSD Workforce Partner at the annual AGO Signing Day, in the community progress report, and in board presentations
- ✓ **A workforce pipeline that costs you one thing:** a committed supervisor and a structured learning environment — BCSD provides everything else

PRIORITY INDUSTRY SECTORS — PARTNERS SOUGHT NOW

Becoming a named AGO partner positions your organization as the employer every Beaver County student knows before they graduate — and the one they're already trained to join.

WHAT WE ASK OF EMPLOYER PARTNERS

- 1** **Commit to openings each spring** — even one internship slot per year creates a documented pipeline and a named partnership
- 2** **Designate a site supervisor** who can provide structured mentorship and complete a student evaluation at semester end
- 3** **Meet BCSD safety and compliance standards** — OSHA confirmation and WBL agreement review (district legal handles the paperwork)
- 4** **Attend the Industry Advisory Council** — two meetings per year where you help shape the curriculum, not just receive the students
