Bob Bedell has been privileged to share the stage with some remarkable musicians and play some unbelievable gigs. Toured the Southeastern US in the 1980s with the college band The Unitz playing campuses, clubs, festivals, and was lucky enough to grace the stage of the Grand Ol' Opry. After moving to Atlanta in 1987, Bedell founded Cathird Seat with Rob Griffin as an eclectic acoustic duo touring extensively from Georgia, north to New Hampshire, south to Florida, and west to the Mississippi River. Catbird Seat was a part of the late 80s-late 90s Atlanta acoustic scene which was VERY talented, supportive, hypnotic, inspiring and unassuming. Stuck between albums and CDs, Catbird Seat put out their first studio recording, *COLOR DESIRE*, on cassette tape only in 1989. Catbird Seat was signed with Sister Ruby Records out of Atlanta, Ga. For their second release, *ONE* of these DAYS (1992), the duo added Brett Norton on bass and Travis McNabb on drums to bring in the full band effect. Simone Simonton took over the drums for the third release, FAIRYTALES and **SONGS** (1994). After a period where Catbird Seat were only playing a few times a year, **Newleaf** was released as the last recording for Catbird Seat (2010). The Atlanta trio trio (Griffin, Norton, and **Bedell**), bid farewell on June of 2011 to a sold out Eddie's Attic in Decatur, Georgia, completing 24 years of folkin' rock (Acoustica). Catbird Seat were privileged to work with award winning engineers/producers: Don McCollister and Rob Gal.
