It's easy to think about this in terms of what you like or don't like, but you should be responding based on what your user would like or not like.


Product	Feature Analysis

Like CK Dislike	because I don't think she would dislike it since it is an outdoor activity, but I don't think she would like it that much since bikes are not as helpful in the winter.	
Product Name: <u>chocolate cupcake</u>	My user would like /dislike	
Like Sust OK Dislike	because she loves chocolate cake, and a chocolate cupcake is just chocolate cake but in a smaller form.
