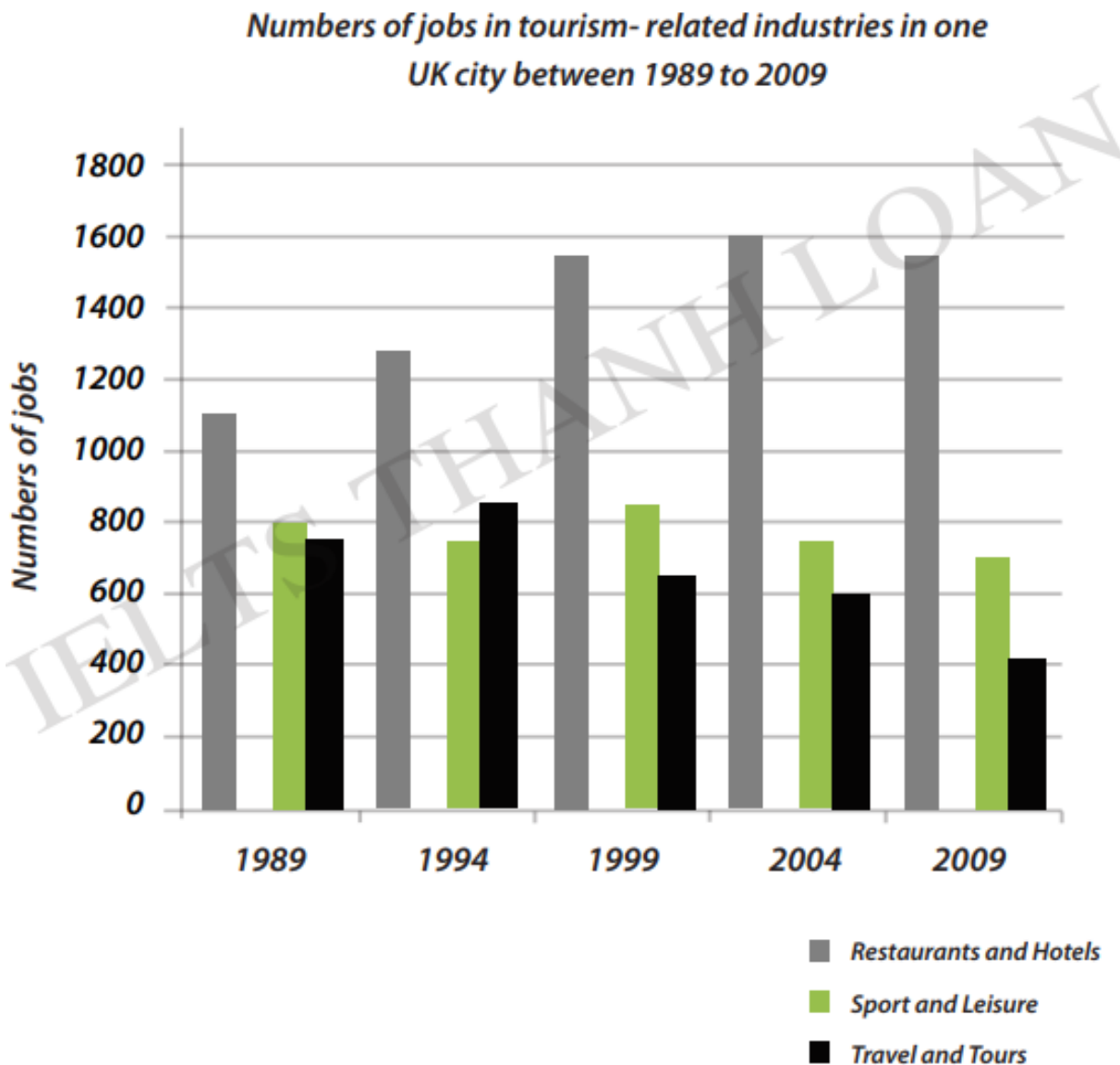


IELTS WRITING TASK 1

You should spend about 20 minutes on this task:

*The chart below shows the number of jobs in tourism-related industries in one UK city between 1989 and 2009.*

Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features and make comparisons where relevant.



The bar chart gives the figure for jobs related to the tourism sector in a city of UK from 1989 to 2009.

Overall, there was an upward trend in the number of employment that worked in restaurants and hotels while the opposite was true for sport, leisure and travel, tours. In addition, most of job in tourism industry in this period was from restaurants and hotels.

In 1989, there were 1100 people worked in restaurants or hotels and this number kept increased steadily before reach the peak at 1600 in 2004. In the next 5 years, this number witness a slight fall from 1600 to about 1500 in 2009.

Meanwhile, the number of people whose job related to sport and leisure fluctuated from 1989 to 1999. This was also true for jobs related to travel and tours. However, in the next 10 years, the number of people worked in those sector reduce steadily from over 800 and over 600 to 650 and 400 respectively. It can also be seen that from 1999 to 2009, the number of people worked in sport and leisure remained higher than the number of people worked in travel and tours.
