II. Introduction and Welcome

III. State of the Circuit:

- A. Came back strong for 2022 from pandemic and virtual season. Some units are still recovering from COVID and rebuilding.
- B. Championships scheduled for two different weekends due to venue availability. AIA members are members of the entirety of AIA and may attend either or both championship events regardless of where they compete during the season. No special action required.
- C. Financial standing. Predicted a loss for 2022 but instead saw a slight gain.
 - 1. ~\$2,300 in penalty fees: primarily late add fees, no shows and withdrawals go to show hosts, other penalties go to scholarship fund
 - 2. ~\$3,000 in donations
 - 3. ~\$295,000 in gross income
 - 4. ~\$241,000 in expenses during the season
 - 5. ~\$54,000 in net income

IV. WGI Advisory Board Update

- A. Color Guard max number of performers raised to 40
- B. Winds judges have been upped from 3 to 4 judges. Similar to percussion.
 - 1. Judges will be trained on the new sheets. Judges are retrained each year.

V. AIA Updates

- A. SRA unit survey and discussion panel with North units
 - 1. Thank you to everyone who participated in either or both of these
 - 2. Continuing to look at possible adjustments to rules and regulations in the future. No plan to address with changes to documents for 2023
- B. Reclassification Proposed New Standard Practice
 - 1. 1st and 2nd place will be reviewed on the day of the show by the judges for reclassification
 - a) Notifications will go out by Monday morning
 - b) Any additional guards with a subscore above the reclassification threshold for the weekend will also be reviewed
 - 2. Can be promoted 1 to 2 classes higher.

- 3. Announcement at the beginning of each awards ceremony recognizing the units competing in a new class at that show
- 4. Discussion from meeting:
 - a) Review committee will be the judges on the competition day, which is the same as prior seasons
 - b) Appeal must be submitted within one week
 - c) Standard practice is not codified in the rules and regulations. This does not change any existing rules and regulations.
- C. Colorguard Regional A Championships
 - 1. Considering Rounds for the regional A classes depending on the size of regional A classes. This may vary between regions.
 - 2. Discussion at meeting:
 - a) Would the winner of each round be automatically reclassified?
 - b) How are groups placed into rounds? Seeding process that was already in place for prior season up north. Then placed into rounds like WGI.

VI. Procedure Discussion:

- A. Abstensions
 - 1. Clarification on abstention: abstention means you do not have an opinion and you have removed yourself from vote.
 - 2. Example: 20 people majority would be 11; if 2 abstain vote is out of 18 and majority is 10
- B. 2 min time limit for discussions
 - 1. Suzie will unmute when someone "raises their hand" through the system. They will be unmuted for 2 minutes and then muted at the end of their time.
 - 2. Each person can speak twice per topic. Person who submitted can speak to answer questions.
 - 3. Revised proposals tabled during the Summer meeting with have 2 minutes to present the revised version

Proposal:

Regulation 3.0.2. I propose changing the SRA classes into rounds. Instead of 2 classes with large numbers. There would be 2-3 rounds with names such as Priester Division or Nicholson Division of just blue, red....etc. They would be seeded.

Rationale:

.Rounds would be 8 -15 units instead of have 24 in one round with very little numbers

Current:

2.1 The competition season will begin no earlier than the weekend following January 1 and extend no later than April 30.

Proposed:

- 2.1 The AIA competitive season is a minimum of 10 available weekends prior to the earliest AIA Regional Championship event.
- 2.1.1 The competitive season will begin no earlier than the weekend following January 1 and extend no later than April 30.
- 2.1.2 The key dates for each region (coming out dates, end of reclassification) will be the same for both regions. (See 4.1 for more details)
- 2.1.3 The competitive season may include weekends with no AIA event due to host availability and/or holidays.

<u>Rationale:</u> Clearly define aspects of a competitive season in one location

- Coming out dates have been the same between regions in the past
- Concern with competitive weekends with no competitions. This is due to lack of show hosts, restrictions within bylaws, and wgi schedule

4.1.1 Color guard units (except elementary and middle school classes) must compete in at least one an AIA sanctioned contest or WGI Regional Event hosted by an AIA member by "Colorguard Coming Out Date" which is the fourth competitive weekend of the season. Units They must have competed in TWO (2) at least one additional contest contests by the end of the promotion reclassification period to be eligible for AIA Championships. If a contest in which a unit is registered is cancelled, it will count as one of their required contests.

- Would changes discussed earlier change the length of the reclassification period? No, does not change. End of reclassification is defined by 5.2.1

4.1.2 Percussion and Winds units must compete in an AIA-sanctioned contest or WGI Regional Event hosted by an AIA member no later than the last weekend in February, weather permitting by "percussion / winds coming out date" which is the sixth competitive weekend of the season. Units must have competed in at least one additional contest by the end of the season to be eligible for AIA Championships. If a contest in which a unit is registered is cancelled, it will count as one of their required contests.

Rationale:

This matches what we have done for the past 6 to 8 years with a fixed date for percussion/winds coming out with consistent wording like it is defined for guard.

- This will clarify when percussion coming out is. Slight change to weekend.

The letter must be on school letterhead and submitted to AIA before the next scheduled competition. within a week of the missed event. Units will not be allowed to participate further in AIA events until the letter is received by AIA.

Clearly defines the period for submitting a letter and we do not enforce the last line.
