Learning Objectives for Participants:

1. Identify an effective strategy for determining a hierarchy of aversive stimuli for an individual and a procedure for promoting the generalization of FCR in manding escape.
2. Describe best practice for the order of instruction in teaching listener responding and tacting and how to assess student progress in this area

Description of Type 2 CE Event:

In order to maintain an appropriate awareness of current scientific information in the field of applied behavior analysis in special education (*Guidelines for Responsible Conduct 1.04*), this reading group provides a structured opportunity to review, to analyze, and to discuss recent articles from ABA peer-reviewed journals (JABA, BAP, etc.) around a given topic. This month's meeting focuses on research related to teaching verbal behavior including manding for escape and efficient training of tact and listener responding. Participants will review salient details of

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the articles presented (2), discuss their findings and limitations, and determine how this new research may update the use of best practice procedures in the classroom.
