


ELA - Mrs. Johnson

Essential Question: How does a specific era and its people influence the language of future generations?



In Shakespeare's *The Tempest*, the protagonist, former Duke of Milan Prospero, created a storm to bring a ship to his island. The ship's passengers include his brother, Antonio, who usurped Prospero's dukedom of Milan. We have discussed the themes of betrayal, reconciliation, and redemption and considered the characters' situations, as well as real life instances.

Shakespeare's plot and characters' actions reveal truths about human nature. These traits are shared by all humans and are influenced by society. Students will write responses explaining instances when human nature made a character(s) behave or respond in a certain way. Please check the Google Classroom calendar frequently. It is a busy time of year and Shakespeare is a challenging unit! 😊

Math - Mr. Daigneault

In 8th grade math we are quizzing today on the topics of the past week:

Block A and E: Classifying numbers, estimating square roots, Pythagorean Theorem and distance on a graph.

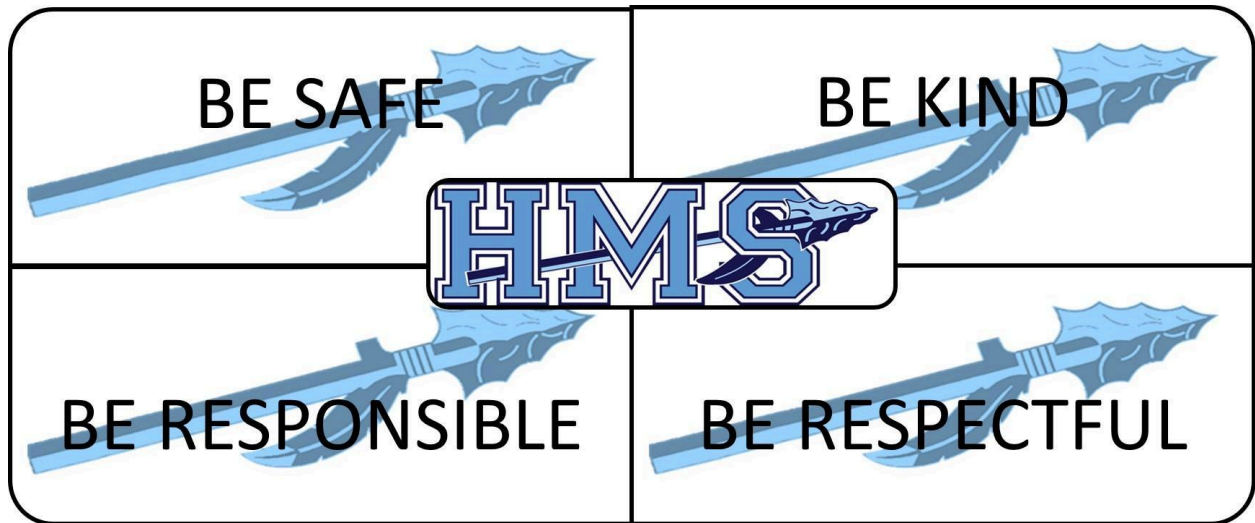
Block D: Volume, scientific notation, and exponent rules
