Protocol:

Adapted from Three Levels of Text Protocol, From School Reform Initiative | Original here

Purpose: This guide is designed to deepen the understanding of a text and explore implications for participants' work.

Facilitation: Stick to the time limits. Each round takes up to 6 minutes per person in a group. Emphasize the need to watch air time during the brief group response segment.

Roles: Facilitator/timekeeper (who also participates); participants

Process

In large groups, refresh yourself with the text/podcast. Choose what you'd like to share with the group.

- 1. In small groups, introduce yourselves (Name, Org/farm, City, State)
- 2. Choose who shares first. Speakers should time themselves, using 1-3 minutes to:
 - a) Read aloud the sentence/phrase/passage they have selected. What did you think about the passage? What are the implications for your work of being an anti-racist farm-based educator? How does reading this impact how you think and act?
 - b) Others respond (for a total of up to 3 minutes) to what has been said. (Someone needs to keep time!)
- * It's okay to pass! Being an active listener to others is as important as speaking.
- 3. Repeat until everyone who wants to has shared.
- 4. If your group finishes and there is still time, share any resources you've been reading/listening to/discovering that are relevant to this work.
- **If someone else has already read the passage you selected, you may still choose to share that one. You may take away a different meaning from it.
- 5. Come back together in the large group. How did this protocol work?
