To help clear out your holiday recycling, our next Recycling Blitz will be held the morning of Wednesday, Jan 5th (there will be no recycling date in December).


We accept plastic, glass, aluminum, steel, tetra and gable containers, including those used for juice, water, pop, beer, wine, liquor, spirits and even egg nog!

- Please use our drop off location at the top of the playground beside the parking lot. Many parents are dropping their child off directly in front of the student entrance. Guidance Ms. Megan Ennis forms were sent home with students on Friday, November 26. If you wish to have your child(ren) vaccinated at school please return your COVID-19 vaccination consent form to the school by December 3 (please note the change from a previous email where we requested a return date by Dec 8. Public Health needs the forms earlier than we anticipated. Our apologies if this causes any confusion). Your child cannot be immunized in school without a fully completed and signed consent form. If your child has received a COVID-19 vaccine in a public clinic or has an appointment at a public clinic, please do not complete the consent form.

Parents/guardians will be permitted to enter the school to support their child during immunization. Parents who wish to accompany their child will be required to wear a mask but do not have to show proof of vaccination. Please call the school at 754-2690 to arrange your appointment time to accompany your child.

To help this day go as smoothly as possible please dress your child in a short sleeve shirt that can be moved up and over the shoulder joint, e.g. stretchy fabric. If you are concerned that your child may be cold, a cardigan or zip up hoodie that can easily be removed is a suggestion to remedy this concern.

Children aged 5 years to 11 years of age will require a second dose in eight weeks. Further information regarding when and where to receive your second dose will be available soon. Please check the Government of NL website for updates. An after-vaccination form will be given to students once they are vaccinated. This form will provide information on possible side effects and vaccine documentation. There will be a contact number if there are questions or concerns related to the vaccine or side effects.

Donations will be accepted until Jan. 19, 2022, and can be brought to school and delivered to Ms.Lehr's % classroom, Rm.307.


(Please drop off cleaning supplies to the office) We are accepting donations for the SPCA of:

Screen time and Young Children: Promoting Health and Development in a Digital World

As promised in our November Newsletter, we are including this resource to help our RRE families navigate this technological world. Below are 10 points to consider as your child is introduced to technology in the home.

Ten Questions to Consider Asking Families With Young Children

- What kind of screens are in your home (e.g., TV, tablet, computer, smartphone)? Which does your child use?
- 2. Is watching TV or programs/movies on other devices a shared family activity and a common way to relax? How often is a screen on in the background although no one is really watching?
- 3. Does anyone in the family use screens during mealtimes?
- 4. What do you watch with your child? What does your child watch alone?
- 5. Do you encourage or discourage conversation with your child while you are using screens?
- 6. Do you ever watch adult/commercial programming with your child?
- 7. Does your child use screens while you do chores around the home? Often? Sometimes?
- 8. Are there any screen-based activities in your child's day care program? Do you know how much these are used?
- 9. Does your child use any kind of

excited and engaged in their learning. Sometimes we even take the learning blocks outside! Check out some of the pictures from their most recent block structures where students were showing what they know about the four seasons, creating their own healthy plates, following directions for their guided turkey drawings, responding to art, seeing what they could build by using only one cup of legos and so much more...








