

<p><b>LESSON TITLE:</b>          Jackson Pollock's Play with Paint</p>	<p>Jackson Pollock  <a href="#">Art with Mati &amp; Dada - Jackson Pollock</a> (7min)</p> <p><b>ARTIST CONNECTIONS:</b>          BOOK: <a href="#">SPLATTER</a> by Diane Alber (4.50min)</p> 			
<p><b>OBJECTIVE:</b>          Students will create colorful artwork by playing with different techniques to apply paint.</p>  	<p><b>LESSON STEPS:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Teacher will talk about how there are different ways to use paint called 'techniques'</li> <li>-Teacher will introduce Jackson Pollock as a painter.</li> <li>- Students will watch video <a href="#">Art With Mati &amp; Dada - Jackson Pollock</a> and discuss:  <i>How does a painter usually paint? What do you notice about how Jackson Pollock painted in the videos? Does he paint like other painters? How does Jackson Pollock use paint that is different? What did they call that type of painting?</i></li> <li>- Students will work in 6 stations around the room to play with 6 different ways to apply paint. 3-4 students will work at one station and we will rotate every 3 minutes.</li> <li>- Station 1:DAB: Q-tips and Cotton Balls</li> <li>- Station 2:SQUIRT: Squirting Pipettes</li> <li>- Station 3: STAMP: Stamping Shapes</li> <li>- Station 4: ROLL: <a href="#">Painting With Marbles</a></li> <li>- Station 5: FLICK: Toothbrush Splatter</li> <li>- Station 6: DROP: Yarn Dropping</li> <li>-Students will place paper on drying rack and help clean up</li> <li>- Students will listen to the read aloud <a href="#">SPLATTER</a> by Diane Alber</li> </ul>	<p><b>MATERIALS:</b>          9x12 white paper, tempera paint, toothbrushes, lids of boxes, marbles, string/yarn, paper tubes, marker caps, Q-tips, cotton balls pinched w a clothes pin, rollers</p> <p><b>VOCABULARY:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-techniques</li> <li>-action painting</li> <li>-splatter</li> <li>-flick</li> <li>-abstract</li> <li>-stamp</li> <li>-squirt</li> <li>-dab</li> <li>-roll</li> </ul>	<p><b>ASSESSMENT:</b>  <i>Students will...</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*Students will engage in new painting techniques at all 6 stations.</li> <li>*Students will listen to video about book Splatter and how Jackson Pollock painted</li> <li>* Model appropriate classroom procedures (Follow directions, Practice active listening)</li> <li>* Follow clean up procedures</li> </ul>
