References in the text are given in square brackets showing the author's name, year of publication (without a comma before it) and, if necessary, pages: [Michalak-Pikulska 2002, 66]. Initials are given after the author's surname only if there are references to several authors with the same surname. If references to several works are given in one place, they are presented in chronological order separated by a semicolon. If referring to a collective monograph, encyclopedia, dictionary, etc., the first words of the title are given in square brackets: [Manzil... 2013]. In-text references are placed at the end of the article, before the bibliography.

Conclusion

Clearly correspond to the objectives. Separately highlight scientific novelty, practical significance and prospects for further research.

Author contributions

Indicate the contribution of each co-author if the article is co-authored.

Statement on the use of artificial intelligence

Mandatory to indicate. For example: "During the preparation of this article the author(s) did not use artificial intelligence (AI) to create text or analyze data." OR "During the preparation of this article the author(s) used <Name of AI tool> for [description of purpose, e.g., language proofreading, data analysis]. The author(s) take full responsibility for the content and accuracy of the results."

Funding

Mandatory to indicate. For example: "The research received no financial support" or "The work was supported by <Name of fund, project, number>."

Optional block.
