Assertions/Conclusions of this Article

To refute this false assertion that because Jesus said 'Moses suffered you to put your wives away' that He meant that the tolerance for frivolous divorce was Moses own doing and against what God would have had.

Here are the passages in question;

He saith unto them, **Moses** because of the hardness of your hearts **suffered you to put away your wives**: but from the beginning it was not so.

(Mat 19:8 KJV)

And they said, Moses suffered to write a bill of divorcement, and to put her away.

(Mar 10:4 KJV)

Because of the way this is worded, these false teachers claim that it is MOSES who is allowing this divorce and quite apparently it is entirely against Gods will that Moses does allow it, according to these false ones.

But this is not the only time Jesus uses this sort of language. See in these two passages where Jesus now even calls it 'your law' to the Jews.

It is also written in your law, that the testimony of two men is true.

(Joh 8:17 KJV)

Jesus answered them, Is it not written in **your law**, I said, Ye are gods? (Joh 10:34 KJV)

If what these false ones claim were true based on Jesus' choice of words, then by His words in these two verses the law that speaks about the testimony of two men wouldnt be Gods law, but would be the creation of the men who He is speaking to.

The same for the second passage. If the Mathew and Mark passages mentioned formerly are Moses doing because of the way Jesus words His statement, then BOTH of these latter passages must also not be GODS law, but the law of these Jewish Pharisees.

Now look at these passages all refering to the law of our God as the 'law of Moses'

(Luk 2:22 KJV) And when the days of her purification according to the law of Moses were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord;

(Luk 24:44 KJV) And he said unto them, These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law **of Moses**, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me.

(Joh 7:23 KJV) If a man on the sabbath day receive circumcision, that the law **of Moses** should not be broken; are ye angry at me, because I have made a man every whit whole on the sabbath day?

(Act 13:39 KJV) And by him all that believe are justified from all things, from which ye could not be justified by the law **of Moses**.

(Act 15:5 KJV) But there rose up certain of the sect of the Pharisees which believed, saying, That it was needful to circumcise them, and to command them to keep the law of Moses.

(Act 28:23 KJV) And when they had appointed him a day, there came many to him into his lodging; to whom he expounded and testified the kingdom of God, persuading them concerning Jesus, both out of the law of Moses, and out of the prophets, from morning till evening.

(1Co 9:9 KJV) For it is written in the law **of Moses**, Thou shalt not muzzle the mouth of the ox that treadeth out the corn. Doth God take care for oxen?

Are those not speaking about GODS law as given by Him thru the prophet Moses?

This is GODS law, not Moses. Nor did Moses allow anything that God did not permit him to tolerate.

Moses did not add to Gods own law regulation requiring a WRIT of DIVORCE without GODS OWN seal of approval.
