

Risk Matrix for Off-Campus Activity and Travel involving Field Research

Instructions for using this Matrix to assign the overall risk level to your off-Campus Activity and Travel :

1. If travelling to a conference, meeting, attending a member institution or similar and the risk Level is 1 (Low) to Level 3 (Moderate) NO Field Activity Safety Plan (FASP) is required but the Traveller Checklist must be completed. For Risk Level 4 (High) and Level 5 (Extreme) if travelling to a conference, meeting, attending a member institution or similar, a **FASP IS REQUIRED**.
For all other forms of field research / activity refer to this Risk Matrix.
2. **FIELD TRIPS** in or around university campuses are generally low risk. If the field trip involves undergraduate students, and if the location, activities, and proximity to EMS are all low-risk, it's considered a low or medium risk field trip and **NO FASP** is required, but the Program Lead must complete the [Field Trip Travel Checklist](#). Please see [the HSE Requirements for Field Trips and Field Schools](#).
3. Start with column two: "Risk Category: Who is traveling? " and proceed to the right across the row. If all conditions apply for each risk category you have assessed the risk level as indicated in that row.
4. You must assess the overall risk based on the highest risk level. For example your location category is assessed as Risk Level 2 (medium), but your activity is assessed at Risk Level 4 (high), then your overall risk is Risk Level 4 (high). Refer to the [Examples of Field Activities with Risk Levels assigned](#), strictly for an overview of field research activities; however, do not rely solely on the examples listed, as individual research activities may vary. Always assess risk using the provided Risk Matrix before engaging in any new activity.
5. Based on the overall risk, take the actions as outlined in the supporting Chart.

An activity that entails hazards or risk no greater than those encountered by average participants in their everyday lives	Close to EMS (within 20 minutes) - e.g. city limits
2 (Medium)	Undergraduate student (Refer #2 above)	A location where Global Affairs Canada (GAC) indicates "Exercise a high degree of caution" .	Activities that entail a higher level of risk than individuals would encounter in their daily lives, but those risks are easily minimized by engineered controls, administrative processes, training and appropriate PPE.	Distant Work Site to EMS (20-40 minutes)
3 (Moderate)		A location where Global Affairs Canada (GAC) indicates "Exercise a high degree of caution" .	Activities that entail a higher level of risk than individuals would encounter in their daily lives, but those risks can be minimized by engineered controls, administrative processes, training and appropriate PPE.	Isolated Work Site to EMS (more than 40 minutes)
4 (High)		A location where Global Affairs Canada (GAC), indicates "Avoid non- essential travel" .	Activities that have the potential to expose participants to hazards that are significantly greater than those likely to be encountered in their everyday lives but those risks can be markedly reduced through engineered controls, administrative processes, specialized training and appropriate PPE.	Isolated Work Site to EMS (more than 40 minutes) + difficult rescue
5 (Extreme)		A location where Global Affairs Canada (GAC) indicates "Avoid all travel" .	An activity for which there is substantial risk to participants and risks cannot be reduced with any reasonable probability.	Isolated Work Site to EMS (more than 40 minutes) + extremely difficult rescue (crevasse rescue, etc.)
